James M. McHugh of Philadelphia, offered the proposition to instruct the state committee for repeal and immediate modification of the Volstead act...

The Pennsylvania compromise approved satisfactory to the administration leaders who accordingly went to the Pennsylvania caucus at 11 o'clock...

Particular General Hoover and Walter Newton, secretary to President Hoover, both appeared in the Pennsylvania conference room.

Meanwhile, the organized prohibition leaders reiterated their determination to withhold final consent to the prohibition plank until both national conventions have concluded.

Some Republican prohibition advocates privately expressed approval of the prohibition plank agreed upon by the resolution subcommittee.

Repeal of the 18th amendment is not aimed for in the plank. It is a clause for repeal of the Volstead act, not the 18th amendment to the constitution.

When Chairman Gerfield began reading the numerous planks presented by the subcommittee, it was challenged by Ambassador Edge on the statement that all planks had unanimous approval.

Upon this statement of Edge, the chairman made an exception of the prohibition plank upon which he deferred action, until the committee in closed session had voted on the many other planks.

The administration subcommittee proposal was approved by the subcommittee on a viva voce vote but some of its language was left for final wording by the whole committee.

The prohibition plank deplores prohibition as an outstanding issue in the economic crisis and depression.

Even before the whole committee met at 11 a. m. to pass upon the prohibition declaration, heads of some of the larger state delegations were requested to call conferences to speed consideration of the proposition by the delegates.

"It is not repeal," said one of the prohibition leaders as the compromise plan emerged from an all-night session of the subcommittee.

Frading consideration by the whole committee, the draft of the re-organization plank was carefully held secret.

Leaders of the repeal forces also started to work on a majority report which senator Bingham of Connecticut prepared to take to the floor.

The Pennsylvania plank was the main of the compromise formula accepted by the subcommittee.

This declaration called for prompt re-organization of the prohibition committee.

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CHICAGO, June 15 (AP)—A resolution passed to instruct the members of the Washington delegation and settlement of four veterans' favored resolution adopted today at the work early today of the prohibition committee of the Republican national convention.

The charge against the La Follette faction was that the resolution was a form of party session by keeping their seats on the convention floor at the direction of President Hoover's name and also during a parade of flags.

Eleven conservative members of the Wisconsin group jointly presented a resolution censuring the Progressives for their action.

Indication as it might be of strong feeling, this action did not have the finality of the denial of seats to a South Carolina delegation headed by the governor's position "Thomas J. Talbot."

The administration passed its organization plank and was not so popular to him and was despite his 20 years as national convention leader the delegation from Michigan headed by Perry Howard, negro, also vigorously was seated.

Talbot, who was read out of the party by President Hoover three years ago on charges of abusing patronage privileges, had won in the national convention. The resolution group contended that decision by a vote of 55 to 10, and seated J. C. Harbison and his followers.

Talbot interpreted the vote as a "slap in the face" for the national committee as well as himself and hoped some one on the committee would lay his case before the convention.

Howard, the national committee member, also had been accused of mis-handling patronage, but the action of the national committee in seating his delegation over that headed by Lambert Howlands was sustained by 32 to 6.

The race questions was brought sharply to the fore in this context. The negro Republican leader denied he had sold federal offices, and contended his organization was as "regional as the multiplication table."

He Howlands contesting group, an all-white delegation, said they would not carry their fight before the convention.

Walter Newton, secretary to President Hoover, and Minnesota member of the resolution committee, and Robert Taft, of Ohio, led the opposition to Talbot. But they stayed out of the Howard-Howlands battle.

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DAWES STAUNCH IN REFUSAL TO RUN WITH HOOVER

Some former service men among the delegates also featured the secretary of war.

WASHINGTON, June 15 (AP)—Charles Gates Dawes in a formal statement today said he would not accept the Republican nomination for the vice presidency if it were offered him.

The former vice president, who withdrew today his name of 1924 as president of the Reconstruction Finance corporation, said he had given the question of the vice presidency "considered thought."

He made the statement at his home in the Willard hotel, personally telephoning it to the Associated Press.

The situation in the convention, as reported by the press this morning, would seem to call for a more explicit statement of my attitude," Mr. Dawes said.

He had followed with deep interest the continued flow of reports from Chicago of a growing movement to replace Vice President Curtis on the Republican ticket with him.

The former vice president had previously denied he was a candidate for the position. He felt that today's statement would put at rest all reports he would accept the post.

He declined to see personally the newspapermen at the hotel where he lives, saying when he was "ready to make a statement" he would telephone it.

He first made a rough draft of the statement, consulting close friends by telephone on the wording of it.
