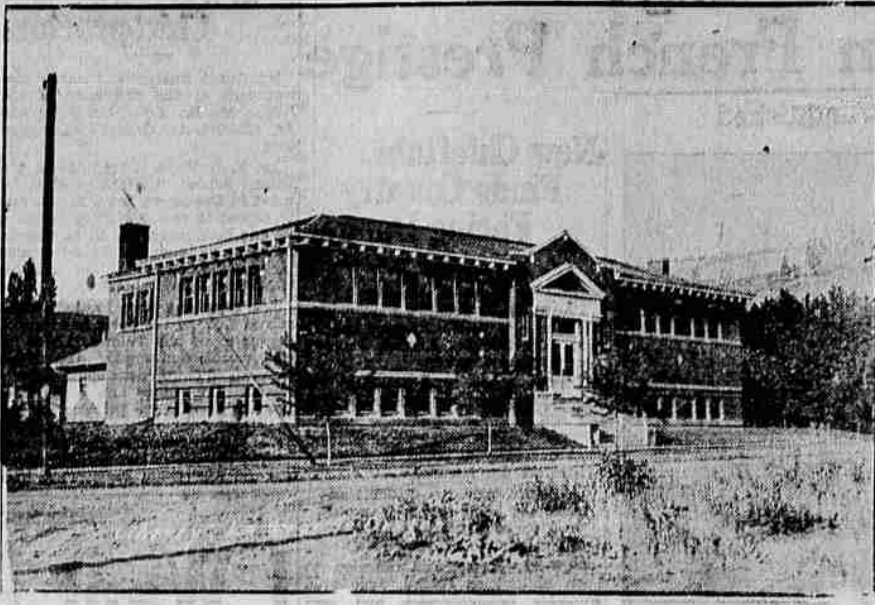


Great Increase In Demand For Library Books

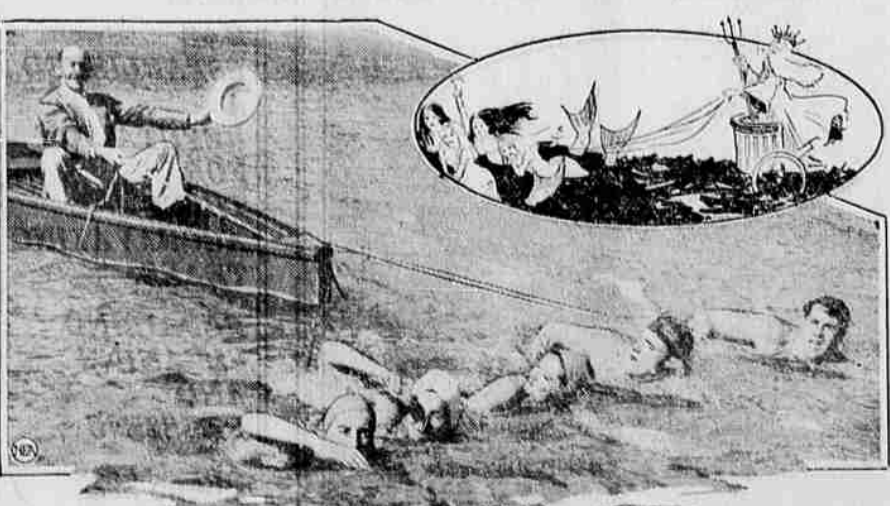
The state highway commission of Oregon, the U. S. bureau of public roads, and the U. S. forest service have all approved the system, according to Mr. Buck.
