The slide toward repeal began late yesterday when the platform committee voted unexpectedly, 35 to 17, to substitute the repeal for a plank originally prepared by Roosevelt men, proposing only that the question of repeal be submitted for whatever action the states might care to take.

Nine speeches scheduled. Nine nominating speeches, limited to 20 minutes each, and an uncounted number of shorter seconding speeches were on the list.

Elsewhere in the platform opponents of the farm board found some satisfaction in the words: "We condemn... the extravagance of the farm board, its disastrous action which made the government a speculator in farm products, and the unsound policy of restricting agricultural production to the demands of domestic markets."

Farm Financing Platform Hailed By Farm Leaders

CHICAGO, June 30 (AP) — Partisan democracy's 90-word platform promise last night of better financing for farmers, development of co-operative movements, effective control of surpluses and stabilization of farm prices, was hailed by men who had given thousands of words of advice to the platform committee as a workable plank.

Among them was Edward A. O'Neal, president of the American farm bureau federation. With grange and farmers union leaders he had appeared before the platform committee to urge equality for agriculture with other industry—equality of tariff protection of financing machinery, of prices and of taxes.

One by William G. McAdoo, would favor guarantee of deposits in federal reserve member banks. One by Governor "Alfalfa Bill" Murray of Oklahoma, for which he made a speech during the night session, would propose immediate payment of the soldier bonus, re-chartering of the "scotch" system of banks, and various economic projects.

Action on these remaining questions and final adoption of the platform was all that remained on the calendar ahead of the long succession of nominating speeches, expected to keep the stadium resounding until late afternoon.

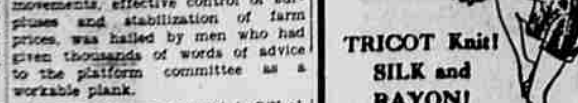
