

Governor Dern of Utah Elected President of Western Coalition

CHICAGO, June 30 (AP)—Gov. Geo. H. Dern, of Utah, was elected general president of the western states Democratic coalition at an organization meeting here Wednesday. The league's purpose is to solidify support in the eleven western states in behalf of the Democratic national ticket in November, but the organization will continue in action on mutual economic and political matters.

Carl Donagh, of Portland, Ore., was elected general secretary and Louis P. Donovan, of Shelby, Mont., general treasurer. At caucuses to be

held during the Democratic convention each of the states represented will elect a vice president and an assistant vice president who shall be a woman. Today's meeting was presided over by G. H. Harry of Portland, sponsor of the coalition plan. States represented were Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, Utah, Arizona and Wyoming. Each state, in addition to a vice president and assistant, shall have three board members who will supervise operation of the organization in the several states.

As the first step in carrying out the organization's plan, the league instructed Gov. Dern and Secretary Donovan to present to the resolutions committee of the national convention the western attitude on silver, copper, lumber and banking. Considerable dissatisfaction was expressed with the action of the resolutions subcommittee insofar as the western viewpoint is concerned. Special attention was called to the demand for satisfactory planks on silver and copper. Fred Johnson of Wyoming, president of a similar Democratic organization in the Rocky mountain states in 1928, told of results he believed could be accomplished by the organization.

Pierce For Dern
Walter M. Pierce, of La Grande, former governor of Oregon, pressed the candidacy of Gov. Dern as vice president of the Democratic ticket, declaring that after the usual complimentary "favorite son" votes taken by the western states, united support should be given the Utah governor. Oregon's nominal vice presidential candidate is Milton A. Miller, of Portland, who will be nominated by Pierce.

Wilson McCarthy, of Salt Lake City, director in the reconstruction finance corporation, urged that each of the states represented in the western coalition use the organization to further a united front on economic problems as well as political attitudes on which the states meet on common ground. Hudson Shore, of Seattle, promised Washington's co-operation. Montana was represented by J. D. Burke, of Lewistown and Mrs. W. W. Hamilton of Dodson. Utahans were pleased with the reception accorded Dern at this meeting. They believe the recognition given the governor by electing him president of the organization and the response in his address will go far toward solidifying the west in his support. While several western states have favorite son candidates for the vice presidency, Dern supporters believed he will receive their votes after one complimentary ballot for their candidates.
