Butterfat Price Spread As High As 2c In Spots

PORTLAND, July 1 (Sp)—Spread in butterfat prices at this period, while generally only 1c to as high as 2c in spots.

Slight renewal of the fight for control at country points has created an abnormal situation in the trade; Portland churners paying as much, if not more, in spots, at country points for fat than for delivery at their plants here.

There was no further change in the butter market for the day. Trading in the egg market continues more or less of unchanged character and even of price.

Trading in the live chicken market continues of slightly better character with prices held intact. Demand includes all lines with broilers and light hens in best call.

Very quiet trading lone continues for live ducks around 11 to 12c lb.; the former being not buying price.

Apricots on Market First home grown apricots of the season, from Millers, Ore., were reported in today. Fifteen boxes of five fruit arrived and sold at 80 to 90c lb.

Bidding prices are continued in the market for tomatoes with further reductions in California-Texas stock and some moderate readjustments in local hotheouse. Dales stock is not in supply sufficient to generally establish a price.

Irigon Apples Received First Oregon grown apples from Irrigon sold at 60c to \$1 per half apple box. Quality is fair.

There is a shortage of watermelons in the local trade, due to the lack of profitable handling on and shipments. The shortage occurs just when the demand should be greatly increased.

Notes of wholesale trading: Country killed calf market active with prices well held. Dressed lambs are trifle easier; few tops above 7 1/2c lb. Dressed hog market is steady. Beans are weak for both green and wax.

Green corn offerings are increasing; worms in plenty. Cantaloupes are about steady for quality. Old potatoes continue to move fairly well; mostly 85c to \$1 to retailers. New potatoes and new onions are steady.
