### Egg Market Not Strong But No Price Changes

PORTLAND, July 8 (AP)—There are two schools of interests trying to artificially advance the price of eggs in face of a trade that appears unwilling to make such a movement.

The real market for eggs is not showing the strength previously indicated, instead of the advance that is being tried by manipulative interests. There is no change in the selling price of eggs and there is no shortage of supplies, even though receipts are decreasing.

"We are supplying every want of the trade at the quotations listed," advises Manager Dixon of the Pacific co-ops, "and have plenty for all needs."

General trading trend of the better market is not better than steady. In fact in spots the situation appears a trifle dull, even though the market continues to drop and some forecasts have been for a fractional advance in the price.

There is a rather good demand in the market for live chickens. The entire line is showing a strong tone at the late price advance offered by killers. Turkeys are arriving and generally selling 10c for best dressed hams.

In spot's the market for tomatoes is up a trifle here with the trade getting larger day by day as a result of the low price. Hothouse stock is up 1 cent pound.

There is a demand for good green corn but the market is receiving considerable stock that is not so good. Sales of the best are being made around 25 to 30c dozen.

More or less excitement results from the extreme shortage of string beans. Both yellow and green stock are very scarce with prices higher for the day.

Very keen demand is showing for loganberries along the wholesale way with wholesale prices up to 75 cents crate generally for the day. Raspberries and blackberries are just about holding. Strawberries are of nominal volume.

Owing to the greatly curtailed crop in the Kennebec section, a somewhat firmer trend is shown for potatoes.

Notes of wholesale trading: There is a real shortage of radishes and prices are up. Spinach is scarcer and higher. Cantaloupe market is stronger for quality with some advances.

Country killed meats are cleaned up generally with prices steady to firm and higher.

New apples are rather slow sale with increasing supplies of Transparent.

### Oregon Pasture Conditions Good; Stock Excellent

CORVALLIS, Ore., July 8 (AP)—With cattle prices taking an upward trend, Oregon range and pasture conditions are reported generally good to excellent, according to information gathered from county agents and other sources by the O. S. C. extension service co-operating with the U. S. D. A. bureau of agricultural economics.

Lower ranges are beginning to brown but livestock are in excellent condition. A heavy increase in grass fat cattle over the last year is reported from Crook county.

Cattle prices at Chicago made another gain of 25 cents during the week, although prices at Portland remained unchanged.

Hog prices have advanced almost steadily in the past month and have now reached a high point for the season at \$5.50 in Portland and \$5.35 at Chicago for top quality light butchers.

STOCK PRICES HIGHER  
CORVALLIS, Ore., July 8 (AP)—Live-stock prices generally held their own or went higher on Friday's markets as reported by government leased wire to the O. S. C. extension service co-operating with the U. S. D. A. bureau of agricultural economics.

Quotations on lambs were steady or higher on all markets reporting while hog prices at Chicago rose again.

The Portland lamb market was steady. San Francisco was up 15 to 25 cents. Chicago was steady and Omaha active to 25 cents higher. Chicago hog prices were up 10 to 15c to a top of \$5.50. Chicago cattle prices were higher on practically all killing classes.

WOOL MARKET  
BOSTON, July 8 (AP)—The Commercial Bulletin tomorrow will say: "The wool market is more active and prices are firmer throughout the day. Some of the largest mills are taking respectable quantities of wool at fully last week's values. Demand has been chiefly for the fine and the half-breed combing wools."

"Sales of fine men's wear have been of decently good proportions and there have been fairly good sales of fine yarns for women's Jersey fabrics."

"The movement of wool from western growers is continuing more or less steadily, mostly on consignment, but dealers are showing somewhat more disposition to buy wool outright. Prices are fully maintained in the west."

"Mohair continues dull in the local market with prices hardly more than nominal."
