Presidential Camper Returns to Desk

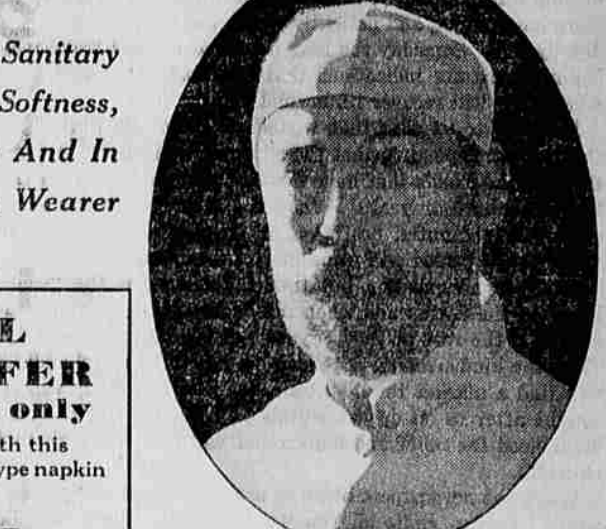
