Stretching his vast bulk more than 65 feet from head to tail and weighing more than 72 tons, the gigantic whale captured recently off the California coast and pictured above will arrive here Monday, July 25, and will be on exhibition in a special railroad car on a siding at the freight depot for three days. The huge mammal, which came near losing its lives in his capture before he was conquered, lies under a glass case. The whale has been perfectly preserved by embalming, a process which required more than 38 barrels of fluid...
