PORTLAND, July 28 (AP) — Continued decrease in the market of butternuts locally is reflected in current offerings here although some increase is noted in offerings from the country. The latter appears due to the fact that supplies are being switched from local to distant markets to Portland because net values here continue among the best available. Sales of new crop apples and especially the new pack of California Gravenstein, are unusually low. Trade in these is no higher than \$1.10 for fancy wrapped. Local jumble stock around 65 @ 75c box, and very slow. Butterfat market is showing considerable strength at generally maintained prices.
