

Maryland Bonds Sold Wednesday For \$105,6079

ANNAPOLIS, Md., Aug. 11 (AP) — The sale of more than \$3,000,000 in bonds for one of the highest prices ever received in Maryland's history was accredited by Governor Albert C. Ritchie to the state's budget system.

The Mercantile Trust company of Baltimore and associated paid \$105,6079 for each \$100 par value bond at the sale at the state treasurer's office yesterday.

With government securities at a discount and with other state and public securities without any market at all, Governor Ritchie said, "Maryland stands out as at least one state whose credit is beyond question."

The funds from the sale will be used for construction and improvement of state hospitals, memorials, schools, penal institutions and national guard armories.

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 11 (AP) — An advance of 1/2 cent a pound in the price of standard cube butter on the Portland produce exchange for the late season Wednesday, reflected the generally improved sentiment in the trade along the Pacific slope.

During the past few days there has been a strong demand for cube butter and makers have been unable to fill orders for fresh churning.

Butterfat values continue to show strength as the supply of butter dwindles.
