# Lehtinen Drops Out; Kusocinski Beats Hill

## POLAND'S GREAT DISTANCE STAR DECISIVE VICTOR

Ralph Metcalfe Equals World Record of 10.3 Seconds For the 100-Meter Dash.

CHICAGO, Aug. 19 (AP)—That dispute between Lauri Lehtinen of Finland and Ralph Hill of Oregon, over superiority at running 5000 meters, will have to be settled some other time, and it probably will be best to keep Janusz Kusocinski, Poland's great distance star, out of it.

Hill and Lehtinen, the latter winner of a judge's decision in the recent Olympic games at Los Angeles, after a long argument over the question of 1000 meters, started out to settle their difficulties last night under artificial lighting at Soldier field. The occasion was a post-Olympic meet, in which stars of several nations competed before about 35,000 spectators.

The Polish ace decided to get into the argument, and before the race was finished, Lehtinen had dropped out, and at the end, Hill was a pretty thoroughly beaten runner. The Finnish runner explained that a lunge and had handicapped him 100 meters to permit him to follow Kusocinski's pace. Hill made a battle of it, but the Pole won easily in 14 minutes, 59 seconds, about a half minute slower than the winning time at Los Angeles.

Metcalfe Equals Record

Performances in the other event with the exception of the 100 and 200 meter runs, were not exceptional. Ralph Metcalfe tied the world record of 10.3 seconds for the century, and Erich Brockmeyer, of Germany, equaled the Olympic standard of 21.2 seconds for the longer race. Ivan Puzos, of Indiana, outdistanced Alex Wilson, of Canada, in the 400 meters, winning in 47.8 seconds, and Phil Edwards, Canada's negro star, won the 800 meters from Dr. Otto Neugebauer, of Germany, and Charles Hornbostel, of Indiana, in 1:55.

Stella Walsh, of Cleveland and Poland, won the 100 and 200 meters in the broad jump and took fourth in the discus among the women, while Babe Didrikson, of Texas, won the high jump, and was second in the discus. She broke the record in the latter event, but Judwiga Wajsborn, of Poland, went her 137 feet 3 1/2 inches.

CHICAGO, Aug. 19 (AP)—Charlie Jamieson, one of Cleveland's baseball luminaries, today was placed on the voluntarily retired list by Commissioner Kenesaw Mountain Landis.

The veteran flyhawk of the Indians was used almost exclusively this season as a pinch hitter.

Bob Burke of the Washington Senators, who pitched a no run, no hit game last year against Boston, also was placed on voluntarily retired list.

Outfielder Robert Workington of the Boston Braves, out with a broken leg, was the third major league player to be given voluntary retirement by the commissioner.

loans to farmers, aggregating \$65,000,000, have been made by the secretary of agriculture out of the \$70,000,000 thus far allocated to him.

"Contrary is True"

"It has been said that the reconstruction finance corporation benefits only the great city bank and other large institutions. Mills continued. The contrary is true. The great majority of banks which have borrowed from the corporation are located in small towns. Specifically on July 30, seventy per cent of the banks to which loans had been authorized were in towns of less than 5000 population; 86 per cent were in towns of less than 25,000 population and 96 per cent were in towns of less than 50,000.

"Looking at it from another angle, we find that loans have been authorized to more than 20 per cent of all the banks in the country, these banks having about 15,000,000 of the forty million bank depositors in the United States. These have been directly affected by the corporation's loans to banks while the other 25,000,000 have benefited indirectly by the corporation's activities in preventing the fire from spreading."

Restoring Confidence

Mills said the corporation's activities had tended more and more to restore confidence in financial institutions and that the shrinkage in bank deposits and bank credits which had been proceeding at a disastrous rate for months has been partially checked.

"Men may not look to the immediate economic future with complete assurance," Mills said, "but today they are at least facing it unafraid. Our ship has come through a financial hurricane with much suffering, some broken spars, torn sails and wreckage on deck but the hull is sound and neither crew nor passengers doubt that we shall come safely to port."
