A committee may be one person or it may be more persons appointed or chosen by a larger number or an organized body to give some special service.

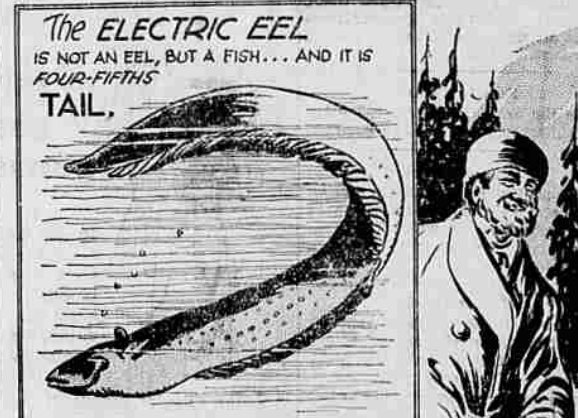

Chese Croquettes In a sauce pan melt 3 tablespoons butter. Add 1-3 cup flour, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon paprika. Cook and stir about three minutes.
