

# Portland Within Half a Game of Coast League Pennant

## BEAVERS WALLOP SEATTLE AGAIN WITH STARS IDLE

### Rain Prevents Hollywood, in Second Place, From Playing Los Angeles Thursday.

Portland lightened its grip on the Coast league championship by making it three straight over the Seattle Indians Thursday night, 11 to 1, while the second-place Hollywood Stars were idle at Los Angeles because of rain.

The Ducks, with a four and one-half game lead over the Stars and with the latter having but five more games to play, now lack only one-half game of being mathematically certain of the pennant. Another Portland victory or a Hollywood loss will give the Ducks their first championship in 18 years.

In beating Seattle Thursday, Portland had to overcome a 5-run lead to win. They opened up with an offensive in the fifth inning that netted them 9 hits and 8 runs. The game was marked with a succession of errors, each team making five. Batters: Seattle, Hald, Freitas and Cox; Portland, Peterson, Jacobs and Palmisano.

The Senators registered their second victory in a row over Portland Thursday night, bunting their hits off Bill Ludolph, Oak tinner, to win, 6 to 4. The Oaks, after being held by Flynn to three hits in the sixth inning, to which three San Francisco errors contributed, put the Missions far ahead. ## All But Two Of Coast Teams To Get Into Action

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 30 (AP)—All but two of the Pacific Coast conference football teams go into action in conference opening contests tonight and tomorrow—the exceptions being University of California and University of Oregon.

The honor of opening the season goes to two youngsters of the conference, University of Idaho and U. C. L. A., who will battle under the lights tonight at Los Angeles.

Tomorrow the University of Southern California Trojans, last year's national champs, take the field in their home city against Coach "Babe" Hollnber's Washington State college eleven, and are strong favorites to win.

No conference games are scheduled for the big rivalry, University of California playing the Olympic Club at Berkeley and St. Mary's meeting University of Nevada in Kears stadium here. Both games are to be played tomorrow.

In the north Washington will be host to Montana at Seattle in a Saturday clash, and Stanford university will tackle Oregon State at Portland.

The remaining conference teams, University of Oregon, will meet a large obstacle in the free-wheeling Santa Clara Bronco eleven in a Saturday contest at Eugene.

In 15 years of football coaching at four schools, teams of Dr. Clarence Spears have lost but 26 games out of 135.

## YANKS CONFIDENT ON WESTERN TRIP

### Only Joe McCarthy, Manager, Remains Serious With Two Series Wins.

EN ROUTE TO CHICAGO WITH YANKEE SPECIAL, Sept. 30 (AP)—Rolling along the shores of Lake Erie today, manifesting no more concern than though it was an early season swing into the west, the Yankees spun a tune of confidence in their ability to make it four straight over the Cubs and a world record of 12 straight victories in three baseball championships.

"We're two up and two to go," remarked the eminent golfer, Babe Ruth, who figures he has shaken off most of the effects of his recent illness and is about due to increase his world series output of home runs.

"Unless the Cubs are tougher on their home grounds than they have been so far, we ought to clean up this series quick," added the Yankee slugger.

McCarthy Worried  
The big Yankee party, accompanied by Baseball Commissioner Landis, numbered only one outstanding fellow who did not seem so confident the American league champions would continue to have things their own way, through their own efforts or the generosity of the Cubs. He was "Marse Joe" McCarthy, the manager, who admits he takes his baseball seriously and likes it that way.

"This hasn't been so one-sided as a lot of you fellows think," demurred McCarthy. "One long hit for the Cubs in the early stages of the game might have changed the whole complexion of things. They are a good ball club.

"We've looked good because Ruffing and Gomez gave us the pitching and we hit in the pinches. That's a tough combination to beat.

"Chapman, for example, has been doing the right thing in the right spot. With the bases full in the first game, Chappie raced over to make a great running catch of Herman's

drive that looked like a double. That's the best piece of defensive work so far in the series.

"As for McCarthy, he has had only one hit but he delivered it with the head full and the score tied yesterday in the third inning.

Expect to Start Pippas  
McCarthy figures the Cubs will be tougher to beat in Wrigley field. If so they will have to get steadier pitching than their two ace right-handers, Guy Bush and Lou Warneke, have shown so far. The Yankee manager will start George Pippas, veteran right-hander, in the third game Saturday.

He hasn't decided whether to use Johnny Allen, young right-hander, Sunday. He might come back with Ruffing if the Yankees make it three straight tomorrow. Pippas has a series record of two victories, no defeats.

As they played cards, sang and otherwise passed away the traveling time today the Yankees kidded each other their new record of making long ten hits—all singles—off Warneke.

Lou Gehrig said he could not recall a game when anything so strange had happened in this slugging troupe's output of base hits.

## EUGENE, Ore. (NEA)—Fifteen lettermen back, a wealth of great freshman material developed by the now head coach, and a problem with the central trio of the rush line—these are the football situation at University of Oregon. And how far the Oregonians get depends to a great extent on how well these ex-freshmen deliver.

Gone is "Doc" Spears, replacing him as head coach is "Prent" Callison, who coached for Oregon in 1921 and '22. He became coach at Medford, Ore., high school in 1922, and in six years since then he has had undefeated teams. His last unbeaten team was the 1931 freshman here. And in two seasons before, he had his yearlings lost only two games.

Callison differs from Spears in his grid doctrine because he seeks offensive, and defense at times looks ragged. But there's plenty of aggressiveness and action.

The greatest loss to the team is in the center of the line, Eric Forata, center par-excellence, and Capt. Trev Schulte, guard, are gone, and Bernie Hughes (180), the other starting guard, last year, has been moved to center, with Chuck Swanson (175) an alternate last year, and two sophomores—Gemo and Chase, 190-pounders—also available.

Dutch Clark (191), an alternate last year, seems set for a guard post. Con Furry (180) and Bree Cuppoletti (182) holdovers, are fighting it out with ex-freshmen Froy (183), Smith (184), Coddling (179) and Gagnon (193).

ABOARD THE CUBS SPECIAL TRAIN, EN ROUTE TO CHICAGO, TOLEDO, Ohio, Sept. 30 (AP)—Speeding toward old familiar fields, the twice-thwarted Cubs rose today from their Pullman berths more concerned with the problem of facing the home folks than with the outcome of the world series with the New York Yankees.

In every mind was the thought of the 100,000 rabid faithful who lined the streets of the home town two days after the Cubs won the Na-

tional league pennant, frantically yelling their names, showering with confetti the open cars they rode in triumph to the civic reception in their honors.

The mayor was there in the reviewing stand and all the notables of the city, proud of their champions, absolutely certain they could not be beaten. No city in the baseball world reverses its diamond heroes, worships them quite so intimately and volubly as Chicago.

So it's not difficult to imagine how the rank and file of the Cubs, from Manager Charley Grimm all the way down to the bat boy, felt coming home to that kind of fandom, beaten in both the first two games in New York, having in their own eyes let down the most loyal, most enthusiastic, most believing fans in all the baseball world.

"It gets you down," one of the regulars said as he poked his breakfast victuals listlessly. "I don't know how we will face the bank. I guess we've been trying too hard."

"Underneath this feeling, however, was the deadliest kind of determination to fight it out with the Yankees to the last, to prove to the world and the folks at home that one team can make baseball history and win a world championship after losing the first two games. To a man the Bruins feel that they will have all the advantage at Wrigley field, both in physical factors and the inspiration of their faithful.

"This is a tight spot," said Grimm seriously. "But we've been in tight spots before. We won the National league pennant beating the odds. There's no quit in this ball club."

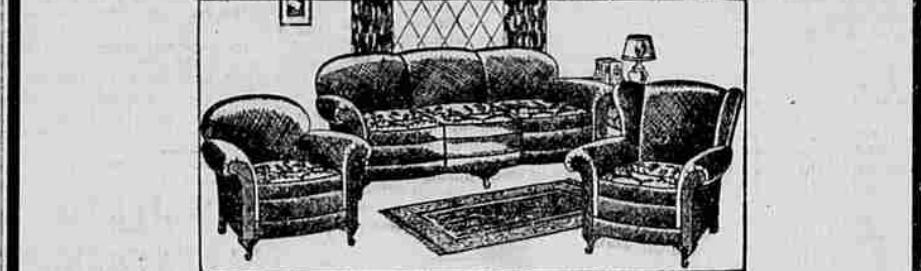
