Shipping business in Oregon walnuts and filberts is considered good and already reports indicate a shortage of the latter.

Potato market is weak with some price slumping at the source.

Tomatoes are being sold 10c @ 20c box with receipts the greatest on record.

Cooler weather is aiding the sale of California artichokes.

OREGON DAIRY HERDS SCORE IN THE EAST

PORTLAND, Oct. 7 (AP)—Oregon butter and Oregon dairy herds, prize winners in many competitions, continue to check in the winning columns in eastern shows.

Word was received here today that the Raven dairy of Portland, with an extreme score of 94 1/2, won the highest award of any Pacific coast butter at the national dairy cattle exhibition at Waterloo, Iowa.

The award was the fourth highest of any received in the country, the higher ones being but fractionally increased over the Portland product.

The Mount Angel college stock farm, Mount Angel, Ore., won second place in the Iowa show in the one-year bull class in the Holstein division.
