

Butter Market In Portland Is Holding Up Well

PORTLAND, Oct. 18 (AP)—Market for butter is practically featureless along the coast. No price changes were reflected locally either for putouts or for cubes and along the coast a similar trading trend is noted.

Portland market continues one of the best in spots of trading under-tone. Storage stocks here are not, and have not been bumper crops the current season.

Butter continues to show strength at practically all points along the coast.

Market for eggs continues to reflect a strong tone for practically all deliveries locally and with prices well maintained. However values at some points are clearly above a selling basis and are being studied to sell more storage goods.

There is more than passing weakness in the market for spring chickens and especially the white ones. Prices are relatively low but recoveries are unable to clean up promptly. Other birds are firm.

With some recovery from the previous week, the market for country killed calves appears a little weaker and even lower priced. Hogs are steady and fairly active as are lambs.

While reports indicate negotiations on for further supplies of cotton to go to China, no deals have been concluded. The Orient is not inclined to pay more and growers appear tired of selling so low. Country leading too limited to consider.

With local potatoes scarce, there is an increasing demand for Washington potatoes here with more of last year's tubers being sold. The trade here is being supplied and it is being increased. Yakima stock dropping.

There is a rather good local movement of corn today and prices are being held steady as a rule. Reports regarding available supplies are rather mixed, showing up country selling to some extent.

Good dressed turkeys are being the day but only of this class of stuff but even of the better offerings. In native new crop birds are finding little favor even to higher generally than last year.

Notes of wholesale trading: Oregon chickens are scarce with a general top of the box.

Lady finger grapes are scarce and Oregon as well as higher.
