HEAVY RAINS IN WESTERN OREGON

Last night was much warmer than earlier in the week, with a minimum of 44 above. The maximum yesterday was 61 above, but a wind from the east in the afternoon brought some discomfort in spite of the bright sunshine. Moon and Agriculture The light of the moon occurs when the earth is between the moon and the sun—her disk being wholly illuminated. The moon is dark or invisible when in conjunction with the sun. But there is no evidence that the moon governs agriculture; it has no appreciable influence on any of the major conditions that affect the growth of plants.
