

# Southern California and U. C. L. A. Remain Unbeaten in Coast Conference

## TROJAN-UCLAN TIE FOR TITLE IS POSSIBILITY

Not Likely, However, With Both Teams Still to Meet Some Stiff Competition This Season.

Southern California's Trojan football championship of the conference and winner of the national title last year, made their most impressive stride toward these goals Saturday with a convincing 10-0 victory over the previously undefeated Stanford Indians.

Undeclared although not official, All West and Washington championship aspirations were expressed in the tie for the leading California team title. The score was tied.

**Trojan Goal Unreached**  
Southern California won, undefeated in some quarters, except for Howard Jones' inexcusable fumble combination that left the Trojan goal line crossed. While the Trojans have conquered more formidable opponents to date, mathematically however, their standing is no better than that of the University of California at Los Angeles Bruins.

The Bruins have two games left and will receive their scheduled next Saturday in a home arrangement with the Stanford Indians. A U. C. L. A. victory over Stanford is not expected, despite the latter's defeat by U. C. L. A. after a reversal notwithstanding would not take the distinction of a stunning surprise in this day and age of sports. The Bruins' activity last week was confined to a non-conference clash in which the southerners triumphed over California Tech by a 50-0 score.

**U. C. L. A. and Bruins Unbeaten**  
As U. C. L. A. and U. C. L. A. have no contest scheduled it is possible although not probable they will tie for the title this year. Each team stands opposite to face before the tie is over. Southern California takes on California Oregon and Washington in the order named, while U. C. L. A. called upon to vanquish Stanford, Montana, Washington State and Washington, a Herculean task.

With its two-conference margin of superiority over Stanford a matter of record, Southern California will take things easy this week with no game scheduled, meanwhile preparing for California in the first Saturday in November.

The Trojans produced a record of the power and a finished passing attack in defeating Stanford. The aerial lanes proved the setting for the victory, a second period touchdown resulting directly from a pass over the goal line. A third quarter score was made possible through a 20-yard punt that put the ball ten yards from the goal. At the first annual win for the Trojans over one of their fiercest rivals.

**California Wins**  
California's Bears have thought to go on their way to a second conference championship when they overpowered Stanford, but they stayed around long enough to score a narrow victory by the margin of a point converted after touchdown. Washington scored in the first period but failed on the try for points. The Bears pushed over a touchdown in the second quarter and added the extra kick on a pass. Archie Williams, who had captured 67 yards for the spring touchdowns, finished the game for 100 to 10.

The Bears will take on an annual non-conference opponent, Nevada, this Saturday with reserves coming in for most of the work while the regular players for Spokane, California and the following weekend.

Having disposed of Oregon State by a 7-0 point last Saturday, Washington State will tackle another conference rival, Montana, this weekend. Montana took a 19-7 beating from Washington State last week in a game that had no bearing on the conference championship. Oregon State made West Coast Army in a non-conference clash, Friday night at Corvallis, Ore.

**Oregon Wins**  
Oregon broke into the conference's victory column over the week with a 22-0 setback to Idaho, and will meet Gonzaga next Saturday in a game that will not affect the position in the circuit. On the same day Washington will tie up against Washington College in a non-conference affair, meanwhile planning ahead for the Nov. 5 test with Stanford at Palo Alto.

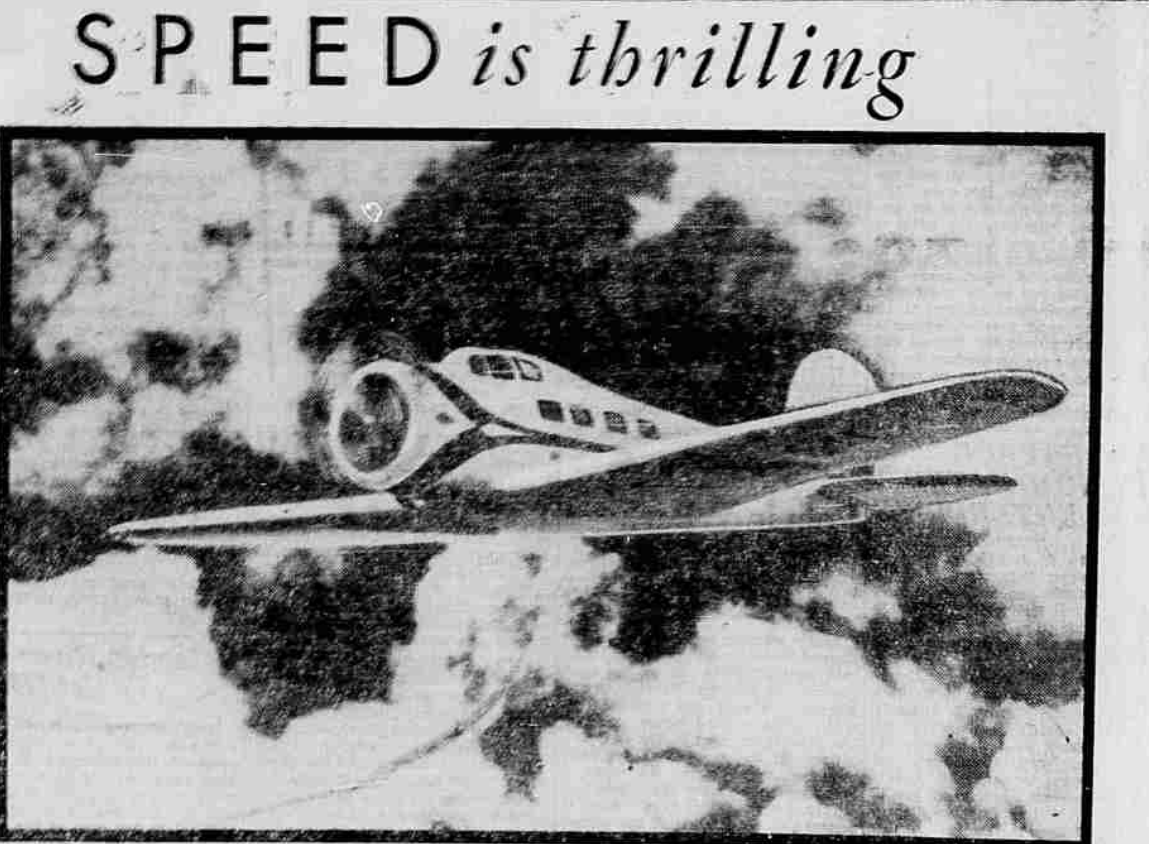
