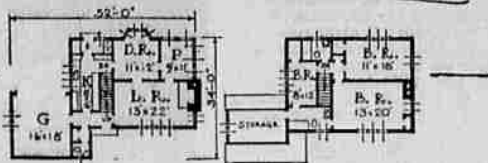

A House With Norman Lines



Both floors of this Norman adaptation have been planned with an eye to the comfort of a family with children. Downstairs there is an abundance of light and air and very well planned entrances, front and rear. Children may go about their play without disturbing the bridge game in the living room. On the second floor, among other features, there is a small child's room, connecting with the master's bedroom through the bath. Should the small room be needed for a maid, the storage space over the garage will make an equally nice child's room. Otherwise, should it not be wanted for storage, it has great possibilities as a playroom. It will be noted that the front hall is the focal point of the house; any part of which—even the garage—can be reached through its six openings. The kitchen is provided with two entrances, and the back entry, with space for storage and the refrigerator, is a major convenience. There are innumerable details of value to the home-owner wishing to be truly comfortable. One is the bay window in the dining room and another the well placed porch, glazed-in and accessible to either dining or living room. The kitchen is well away from the dining room, and there is a lavatory at the left of the front entrance. The roof should be wood shingle, flat tile or slate, laid so that a rough effect is secured. Chalkboards should be French gray, natural rough finish. Stone for the chimney should be local, of warm tone, and the top is of alternating squares of stone and red brick. A lot 60 by 75 feet, or more, is essential. Cost should be between \$7000 and \$8000.

Daughters of American Revolution Hold District Convention Saturday In Pendleton; La Grande Represented

Delegates from the Fourth District, Daughters of the American Revolution, were assembled here Saturday for the convention of the D. A. R. the district comprising Baker, Hood River, La Grande, Redmond, The Dalles and Pendleton. Mrs. John Y. Richardson, of Portland, state regent of the D. A. R., made an exceptionally interesting talk at this morning's session, her theme being "Patriotic Education in the Churches and Schools."

Mrs. Richardson stressed the fact that church and schools are exempt from taxation, and that failure to encourage patriotism is failure to support the constitution. "We have evidence of radical teachers in some of the grade and high schools of Oregon," says Mrs. Richardson. "They begin teaching disrespect for the government by ridiculing our national heroes. In addition, there are some ministers and some faculty members in institutions of higher learning in Oregon who by their teachings are foes of the American constitution."

"The churches and schools of the United States are the hope of our nation for the teaching of patriotism," Miss Abbie Lang, of The Dalles, gave a talk on national defense and Mrs. J. L. Soule on genealogical research. The address of welcome was given by Mrs. J. C. Woodworth, regent of the Umatilla chapter, the response being by Mrs. J. K. Wright, state librarian, of La Grande.

Mrs. J. K. Lottridge, regent of Baker chapter, led the salute to the flag and Mrs. William DeLoach, of McMinnville, acted as chaplain, led the prayer. Musical numbers included numbers by the La Grande chapter, a solo by Mrs. Paul Pollman of Baker and the singing of America led by Mrs. William P. Remington.

Menus Of The Day

By Mrs. Alexander George APRICOT SPONGE A Menu For Dinner

Chilled Cantaloupe Tuna Spanish Style Baked Potatoes Buttered Spinach

Corn Muffins Butter Head Lettuce French Dressing Apricot Sponge Coffee

Tuna Spanish Style, for 6 4 tablespoons butter. 6 tablespoons flour. 3 cups milk.

1 teaspoon salt. 1/4 teaspoon pepper. 2 cups tuna. 2 hard cooked eggs, diced. 3 tablespoons chopped green peppers. 1 tablespoon chopped onion. 4 tablespoons catsup.

Melt butter and add flour. When mixed, add milk and cook until creamy sauce forms. Stir constantly. Add rest of ingredients. Pour into buttered baking dish and bake 20 minutes in moderate oven. Serve in dish in which baked.

Corn Muffin 1 1/2 cups flour. 1 cup corn meal. 4 teaspoons baking powder. 4 tablespoons sugar. 1/2 teaspoon salt. 2 eggs. 1 1/2 cups milk. 3 tablespoons fat, melted. Mix ingredients. Beat 3 minutes. Half fill greased muffin pans and bake 20 minutes in moderate oven.

Apricot Sponge (A delicious dessert) 3 egg yolks. 2-3 cup sugar. 2 cups milk. 1/4 teaspoon salt. 2 tablespoons granulated gelatin. 4 tablespoons cold water. 3 egg whites, beaten. 2 cups apricots. 1 tablespoon lemon juice.

Beat yolks and add sugar. Add milk and salt. Heat in double boiler until little thick. Stir constantly and do not over cook. Soak gelatin and water 5 minutes. Add to heated custard mixture. Remove from double boiler and beat 2 minutes. Cool. Fold in egg whites and apricots which have been sprinkled with lemon juice. Chill until stiff. Serve plain, with more apricots or whipped cream. Other fruits can be used in place of apricots.
