American, British Missionaries On Way to Foochow

FOOCHOW, China, Oct. 27 (AP) — American and British missionaries in the northwestern region of Fukien province are hastily withdrawing toward this city as a result of the advance of communist outlaws from Kiangsi province, whence they were driven by national government troops.

It was understood that the two American groups principally involved are missionaries of the Congregational church with headquarters at Boston and the Northern Methodist missionaries with headquarters in New York. These two missionary autonomous missionary stations in northwestern Fukien.

Two British missionaries have been abandoned, and it is understood that the American Methodist property at Kiangsi has fallen into the hands of Fukien provincial troops.

A detachment from a flotilla of ten American destroyers now on the way from Shanghai to Manila may be called in here if necessary.

SANTIAGO, Chile (AP) — Organization of the Socialist Women's association has been effected by a group of women, daughters and relatives of socialist workers, with the expressed aim of insuring participation of women in public affairs and aiding the government in the program.

The new organization will take up women's political work where the derelict women's club left off at the fall of the Moneda regime, the club not being in practical activities for the present.

First steps will be to help keep down the cost of living, insure food, clothing and shelter for the needy, and further socialist generally. They will have a part in the forthcoming constitutional assembly which is expected to take up various matters pertaining to women.
