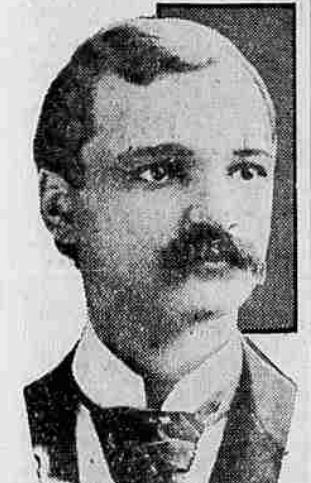

ATHENS, Greece, Nov. 7.—Samuel Insull, who will remain in a hospital while lawyers argue about his extradition to the United States, had his baggage moved out today, but he refused to say whether he would see no one until he has had time to rest.

"We don't know whether he is guilty or not," he said, "and the only thing to do now is to leave the matter of his extradition to the Greek justice on the basis of the Greek treaty with America. SALEM, Nov. 7.—A 25 per cent. reduction in expenditures for all state institutions of higher education is being effected for the current biennium, 1931 and 1932, over the preceding two years, a report by Chancellor Dr. W. J. Kerr issued at the request of Governor Julius L. Meier, revealed.

A savings of \$899,590 was made for the school year 1931-32, expenditures being \$3,834,872, and the estimated expenditures budgeted for the year 1932-33 calls for \$3,468,254, a reduction of \$1,246,208 from the 1929 and 1930 average expenditure.
