Menus Of The Day

By Mrs. Alexander George FRIED OYSTERS A Dinner Menu Fried Oysters Tartar Sauce Buttered Potatoes Creamed Carrots Bread Plum Jam Apricot Surprise Pudding Coffee

Fried Oysters 1 pint large oysters, 1-3 cup flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon pepper, 1/4 teaspoon celery salt, 2 egg yolks, 1 tablespoon cold water, 1 1/2 cups cracker crumbs, 6 tablespoons fat.

Carefully look over oysters and remove any shells. Dip oysters in flour and then into crumbs and into egg yolks which have been mixed with cold water. Dip again into crumbs. Not patting crumbs so that they will stay in place during cooking. Sprinkle

with seasonings. Arrange on shallow platter and chill until ready to cook. When ready to serve place fat in frying pan, add oysters and quickly brown on both sides. It requires about 10 minutes to cook oysters but they should be served as soon as done. Apricot Surprise Pudding, Serving 8 1/2 cup fat, 1 cup sugar, 1 egg, 2-3 cup milk, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1/2 teaspoon lemon extract, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 1/2 cups flour, 2 teaspoons baking powder, Cream the fat and sugar. Add rest of ingredients and beat 3 minutes. Pour over apricot mixture. 1-3 cup fat, 1 cup light brown sugar, 1-2 cup apricot juice, 1 1/2 cups cooked apricots, 1/2 teaspoon salt.
