Maunger Spencer Abbott sends his Beavers against the Indians at Seattle after two weeks of trouble in California. Portland dropped five games to the Missions before being locked by Los Angeles. Seattle had better luck on its southern trip, breaking even in 14 games with Los Angeles and San Francisco.

In the fourth league engagement this week the Missions and San Francisco play a hometime series.

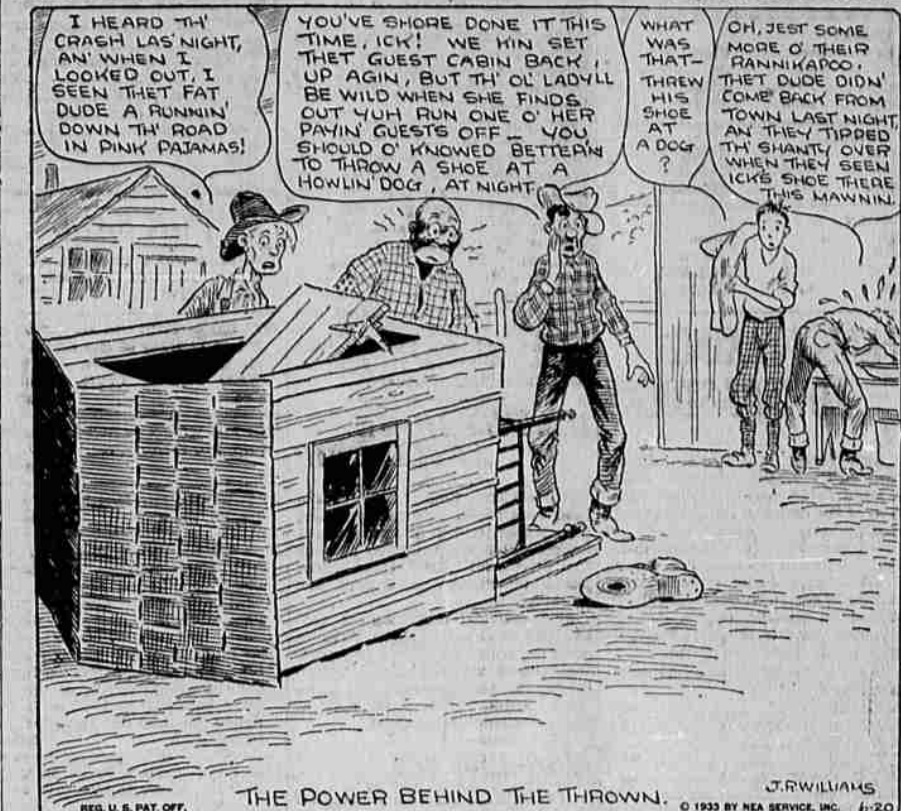
