About 100 women from Union, Cove, Island City, Imbler, Stummerville, Elgin and La Grande gathered yesterday at the country home of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Wallsinger from 2 to 5 o'clock for an afternoon event, a silver tea sponsored by the Francis Brown auxiliary to the Sons and Daughters of Union County Pioneers.

The rooms were decorated in a profusion of yellow and blue wild lupin. Tea was served on the porch at small tables, each decorated with a centerpiece of colorful flowers. Those serving were Miss Hazel Crawford, Mrs. Wayne Reavis, Miss Genevieve Adler, Mrs. Ray Fuller and Mrs. Irwin Moss.

Mrs. Thomas Wallsinger, Mrs. Everett Wallsinger and Mrs. James Moss formed the committee in charge of the event. Several interesting pioneer personalities were among the guests, including Mrs. J. J. 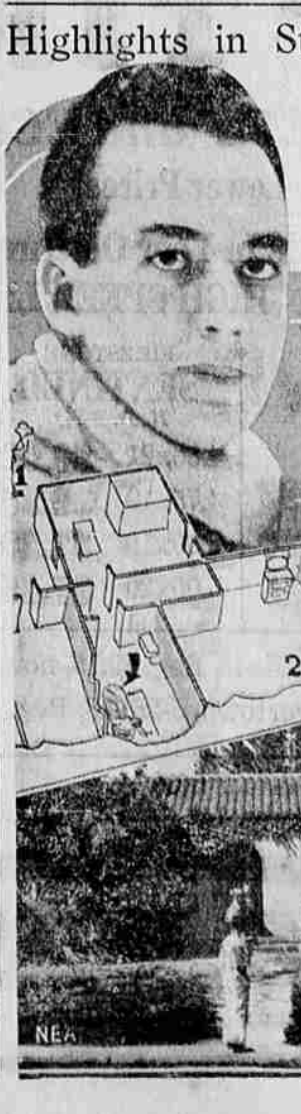
