## Patriotic Note In Some Local Churches Sunday

Vacation Time Also Receiving Attention in La Grande's Houses of Worship at Present.

Fourth of July and the summer vacation both come in for a share of attention at the services to be held in La Grande churches on Sunday—two days before Independence day.

Some of the sermons will have a patriotic note and others will deal with other interesting subjects.

Vacation time already is beginning with the Episcopal Sunday school adjourned until next September.

Sunday programs include: Presbyterian Church (Sixth and Washington) "One of the most intimate events of the week is the gathering together of folks of the community for worship at the place set apart, the church. Here friends meet, friends, Christian meets Christian, worshippers meet worshippers. The morning hour, 11:00 o'clock, at this church offers a place where our interests center around one common theme," says Rev. J. George Wale, pastor in announcing his services. The theme will be "The Gentle Breath of Summer" or "The Blossoming Desert, Springs of Water, the Highway, and Everlasting Joy."

E. E. Hurley, tenor, will sing "Eye Hath Not Seen" by Gaul, and Miss Gladys Miller will play the service. A cordial invitation to all who have no special place to meet for their Sunday morning worship.

First Church of Christ, Scientist (Third and Washington) Services will be held at 11 a. m. Sunday and at 9:45 a. m. Sunday school will be held. Wednesday evening meetings begin at 8 p. m. The reading room in the West-Jacobson Building is open from 1 to 4:30 p. m. each afternoon.

The subject of the Sunday service will be "God."

The golden text was, "The Lord shall reign for ever and ever" (Ex. 15:18).

Among the citations which comprise the lesson-sermon is the following from the Bible: "Let us hear the conductor of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man" (Eccl. 12:13).

The lesson-sermon also includes the following correlative passage from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Good demands of man every hour, in which to work out the problem of being. Concentration to good does not lessen man's dependence on God, but shows the paramount necessity of meeting them. Christian Science takes naught from the perfection of God, but it ascribes to Him the entire glory" (p. 261).

Church of the Nazarene (Birch and Y) Following Sunday school at 9:45, observing visitors' Sunday, the morning service will begin at 11 o'clock with Rev. Daniel L. Swartz, pastor, to speak on the subject "Missions." In the evening at 7:30 p. m. his sermon subject will be "Description of the Kingdom."

The young people meet at 6:45 p. m. for Bible questions. A mid-week meeting is scheduled for Wednesday at 7:30.

Baptist Church (Spring and Sixth) A patriotic theme will be used by the pastor Sunday morning. Special music will be provided by the choir. For the evening sermon the subject will be "The First and Second Adam." Their meetings begin at 7:00. Morning worship begins at 11:00; evening worship, at 8:00; Bible school, at 9:45; Thursday evening prayer meeting, at 8:00. A cordial invitation is extended to all.

St. Peter's (Episcopal) Church (Fourth and O) Church school at the Episcopal church has been discontinued for the summer and will not convene again until September.

Sunday's services will include holy communion at 8 a. m. and morning prayer with sermon and holy communion at 11 o'clock.

First M. E. Church, South (Corner U and Fir) Sunday school begins promptly at 9:45 a. m. with all invited to attend.

Preaching by the pastor is scheduled for the regular 11 o'clock hour and again at 8 o'clock in the evening. Epworth League meets at 7 p. m.

This will be the last Sunday before the conference and all are urged to attend.

Central Church of Christ (Pennsylvania Avenue) July is vacation month for this church and there will be no preaching services until the first of August. Bible school and communion service will be held, also Christian Endeavor.

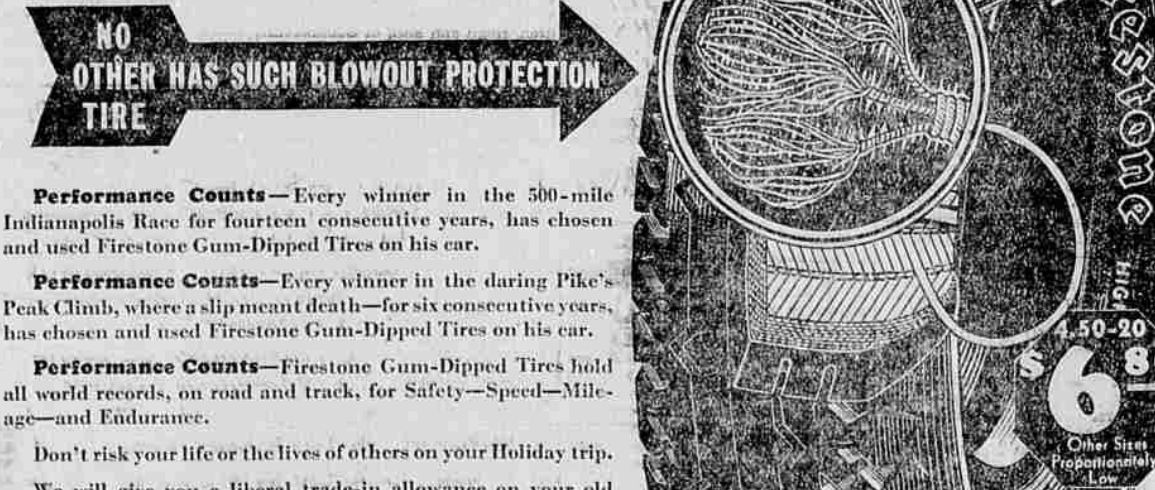
