## Fruit, Vegetable Packages Must Be Marked in Oregon

**PORTLAND, Ore., July 1 (AP)**—All fruit and vegetable packages moving in Oregon trade or transportation channels after July 1 must carry on the container a legible record of who grew or packed the produce, where it originated, and what the quality is supposed to be. The state agriculture department announced that inspectors have been notified to seize or condemn after July 6, all produce not legally marked. The bill was passed by the last legislature.

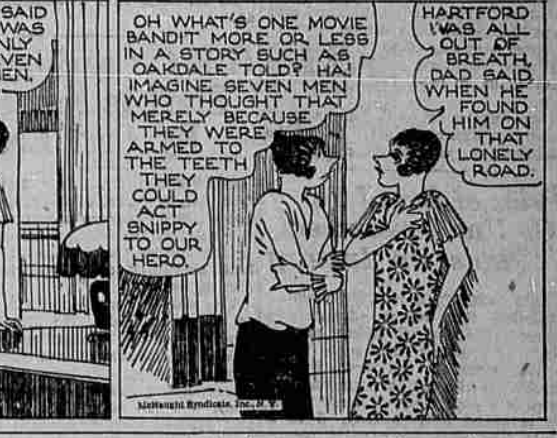

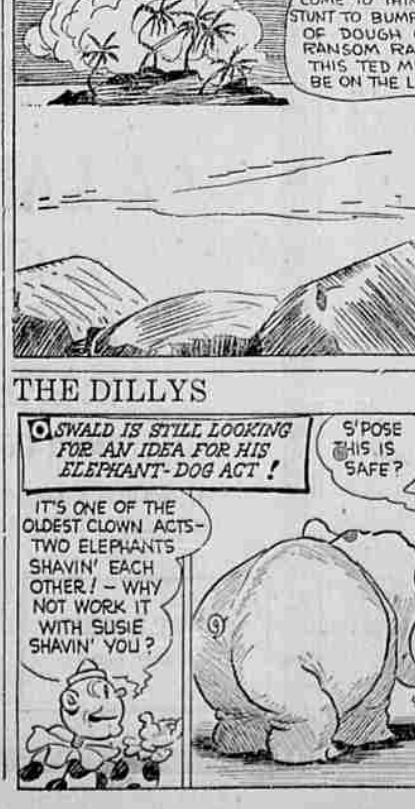
