Just then they heard a swishing sound and, as the Tines looked around, they saw a rope fly through the air. "What's that for?" Coppy said.

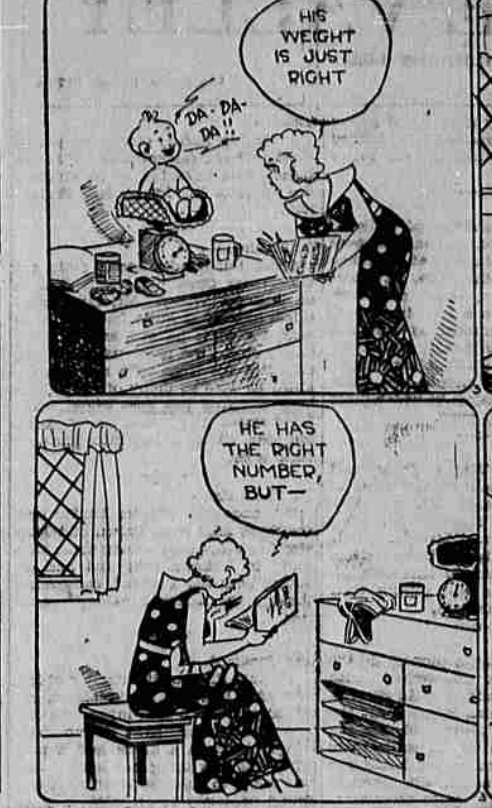

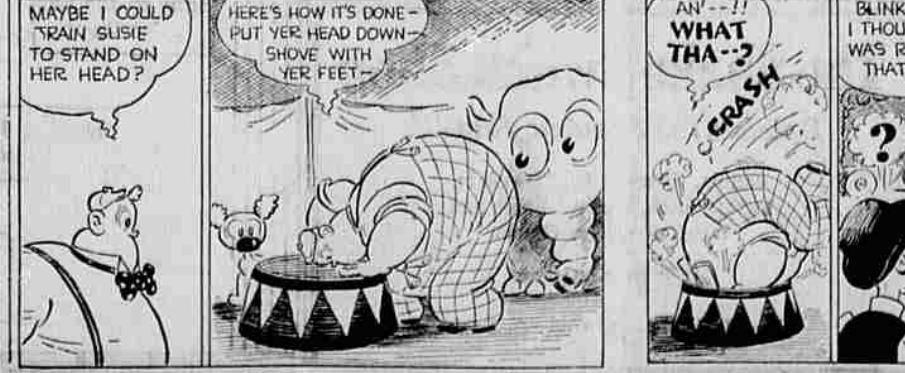

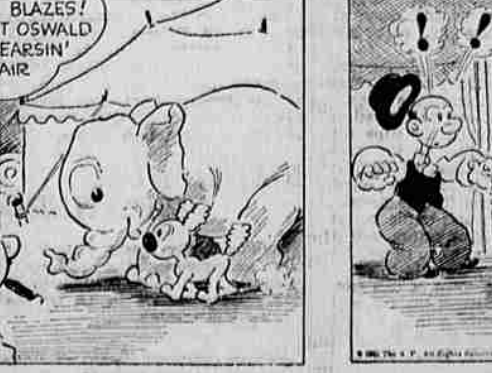
