RISE IN PRICES AIDS EXPANSION OF BANK CREDIT

NEW YORK (AP) - Expansion of bank credit, one of the major offensives on the economic front during the past year in the fight for better business, has started under auspicious conditions.
A year ago when the same strategy was adopted prices were falling, and the effect was negligible. Now the price structure is rising, and banking experts feel that the plan has a better chance of succeeding.
The administration's recovery legislation authorized the federal reserve banks to purchase in the open market up to \$3,000,000,000 of government obligations.
The process works as follows: The reserve bank purchasing the government securities pays for them with federal reserve funds. The seller of the securities generally deposits these funds in his own bank, and that bank in turn deposits them in the federal reserve bank.
When a member bank receives a federal reserve check put into the market through the purchase of government obligations, that bank will use the check either to liquidate an

of its borrowings from the federal reserve bank, or if it is not in debt at the reserve bank it will try to employ the resultant funds by making additional loans in order to earn interest.
The theory of open market operations, therefore, is that purchases of securities by reserve banks lead member banks throughout the country to adopt a more liberal lending policy.

AIDS CUPID

BERLIN - Loans to couples to enable them to be married, thus taking women out of shops and offices and raising the birthrate of the nation have been established by the Reich government. The maximum grant will be 1000 marks (\$295) and will bear no interest. For each child born, 25 per cent of the loan will be cancelled. The recipients, however, must "at all times unconditionally support the National Socialist State."
