### REVIVING WORLD HAILS RECOVERY SIGNS THIS YEAR

WASHINGTON (AP)—World business approaches the midway mark in its 1933 struggle for recovery heartened by indications that it has at last climbed from the bottom of the depression pit.

The world outlook now, compared with that of a year or six months ago, seems generally improved, and some of the most significant business indexes show definite gains in leading industrial nations since the beginning of 1933.

Gains termed spotty. Government economists say, however that most of the gains are still spotty and of an almost purely domestic character. The most striking advances, like those registered in the United States, are attributed in considerable measure to the result of government action to improve the individual national establishment.

One of the most important indicators of economic conditions — a decline in unemployment — has appeared simultaneously in the United States, England, France, Germany and Italy.

Industrial production has made advances in the United States, France and Italy, while production gains made in Germany and England since the low points of last summer have been generally held.

There has been a general firming in wholesale commodity prices, the movement being upward in the United States, Germany and Italy, with quite stable prices prevailing in France and the United Kingdom.

U. S. Indexes Lead. Trade experts say that the conspicuous advance of the business indexes in the United States since the very low point of the banking holiday has not been paralleled or favorably reflected in other large industrial countries.

They explain that there still remains in the path of world business progress formidable mountains of governmental and private debts and great masses of unemployed, both pressing down on consumer purchasing power — the stagnant pool of international trade and piles of "frozen" private capital unavailable for investment.

Hope held for increasing the amount of foreign trade depends largely on efforts to obtain domestic rehabilitation in all countries, as well as the distinctly international matters of stabilizing the currency and setting questions relating to tariffs and trade barriers.

One essential difficulty seen by some in the world situation is the conflict of national and international programs. For instance, America's plans entail possible inflationary procedures, economists say, while such inflation, together with tariffs, serves to make it more difficult for foreigners to sell in the market. Likewise, American sales abroad are hindered by currency difficulties and trade barriers.

A Few Bright Spots. Typical bright spots listed in the U. S. business structure are the gains in industrial production — iron and steel, lumber, automobiles, textiles and food processing — the rise in commodity prices and postal receipts and the improvement in retail trade. Particularly encouraging have been gains in employment and factory payroll advances far beyond seasonal increases.

In relatively stable France, where the industrial production index shows a sustained and fairly sharp rise from the low point of mid-summer 1932, the majority of industrial and commercial indicators were favorable at the start of the summer season.

The general industrial situation in Germany lacked signs of improvement beyond the usual seasonal trends. Slight domestic demand recovery was reported practically offset by the decline in foreign orders attributed to the boycott on German goods after the Nazis came into power.

No industrial production index is computed for Italy, but reports to the department of commerce tell of "encouraging improvement in general conditions, increasing industrial production, steadying of wholesale prices and a balance of trade continuing to be less unfavorable."

In England there was little indication of an increase in general business activity. Commerce reports are that an optimistic feeling is prevailing in British industry and commerce.

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### Reduce Charges Wheat Shippers Pay in Portland

PORTLAND, Ore. (Special)—Of interest to wheat shippers is the action taken at a special meeting of the commission of public docks of the city of Portland in the matter of reducing elevator charges at the 2,000,000-bushel grain elevator, Municipal Terminal No. 4. Beginning with the cereal year starting July 1, there was a general reduction of 20 per cent in all charges with the exception of wharfage of 25 cents which remains unchanged, and storage, together with sacking out, reconditioning sacked wheat and miscellaneous charges, all of which do not take a discount. Pier storage has been reduced from 3/4 cent to 1/2 cent per ton per day. The above reduction in charges is made possible through economies which the commission has been able to effect in its operating costs during recent months.

In connection with the increasing movement of grain into Portland, from upper Columbia river points by water, and ever mindful of Portland's position as a wheat port, at the meeting the commission also instructed the engineer to construct as soon as possible a conveyor for unloading sacked grain from river steamers and barges which will greatly facilitate and expedite the unloading of river vessels. In addition to these immediate plans for handling sacked grain, the commission instructed the engineer to prepare plans for a portable leg capable of discharging bulk grain destined to the elevator from barges or river steamers in order to be prepared to handle this class of tonnage just as soon as the demand for same develops.
