OHIO FARMERS' INCOMES SHOW GAIN THIS SEASON

WOOSTER, O. (AP)—Ohio farmers' gross cash incomes are showing the first substantial gain since 1929, says V. R. Wertz, of the Ohio experiment station department of rural economics.

The gross cash income from sale of farm products gained 19 per cent in May over April, and 14 per cent over May of 1932. Prices of farm products in Ohio were 20 per cent higher in May than in April and 16 per cent higher than in May last year.

The greatest percentage gains in income in May over April were from grains, hogs and wool.

WATERSON CABIN STANDS SPRING HILL, TENN.

THE log cabin in which Harvey Watterson, father of Henry Watterson, lived as a student while attending Manual Labor academy, later known as Jackson seminary and still later as Jackson college, is still standing here. The college itself, founded in 1809, and moved to Columbia in 1836, was burned during the civil war.
