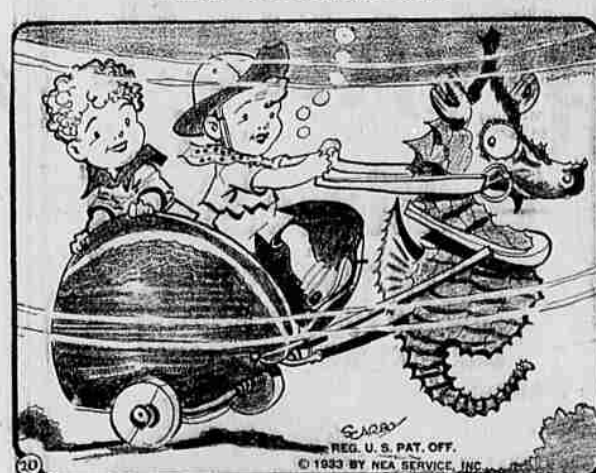
FREE STATE TO MAKE OWN SUGAR DUBLIN

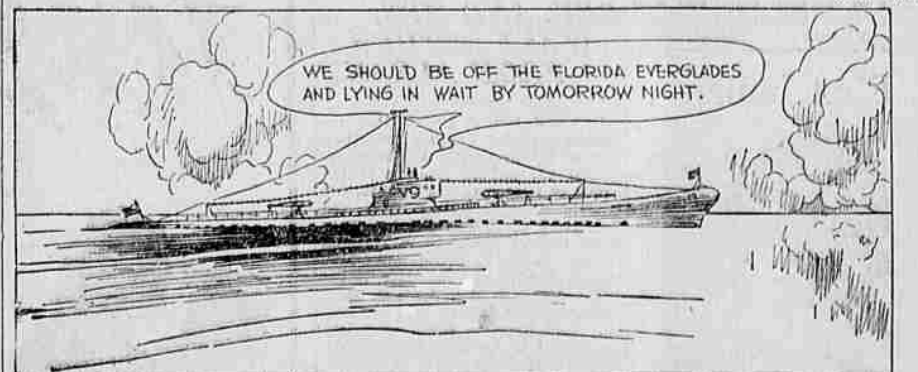

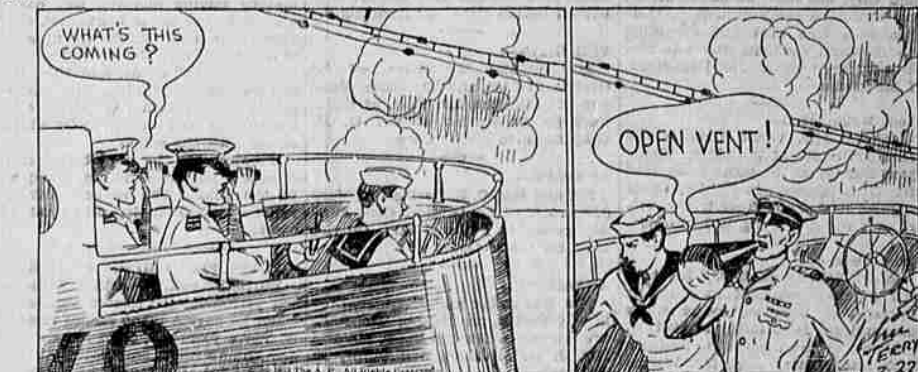
