PRICE OF BUTTER DROPS IN OREGON

PORTLAND, July 25 (AP) — Drop of 1c in the price on top and bottom score butter and 1 1/2c lb. on in-between scores on the produce exchange was not at all unexpected.

The drop in price was the result mainly of outside creameries withholding a large portion of their but-

ter of the market, creating an artificial shortage and forcing some advance in the price. When they started to take profits by shipping their butter they found an overplus of offerings, forcing price declines and general weakness on the open market.

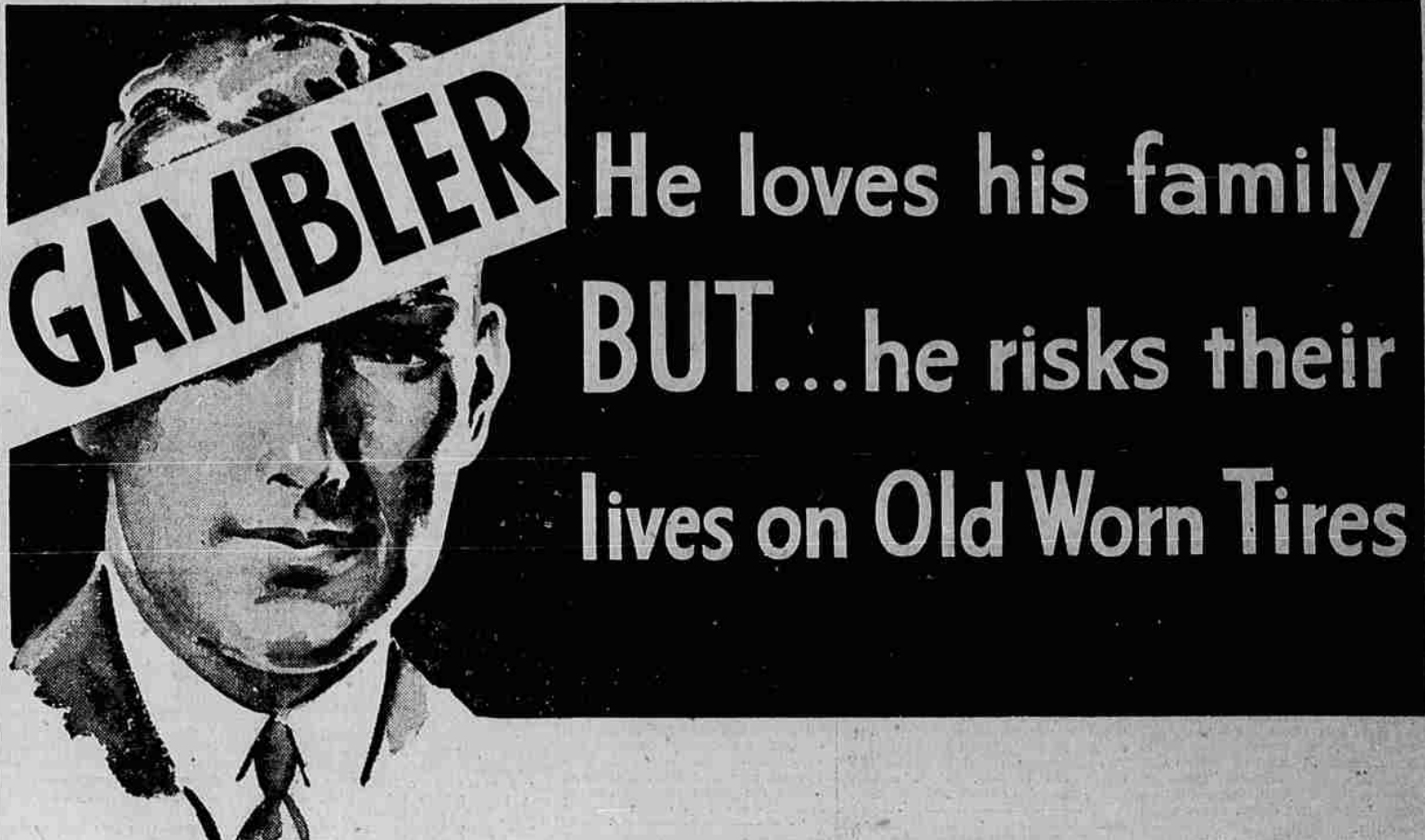
