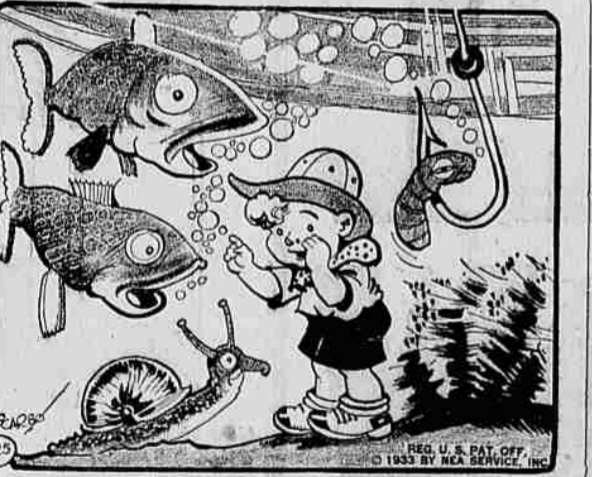
Clingman Defeats Bulldog Jackson

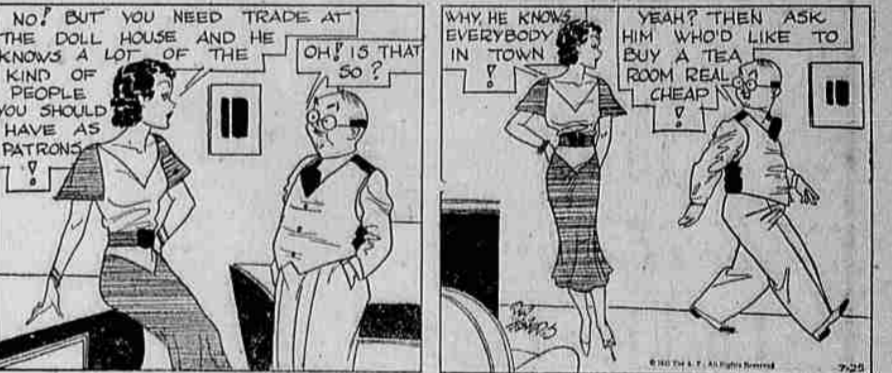

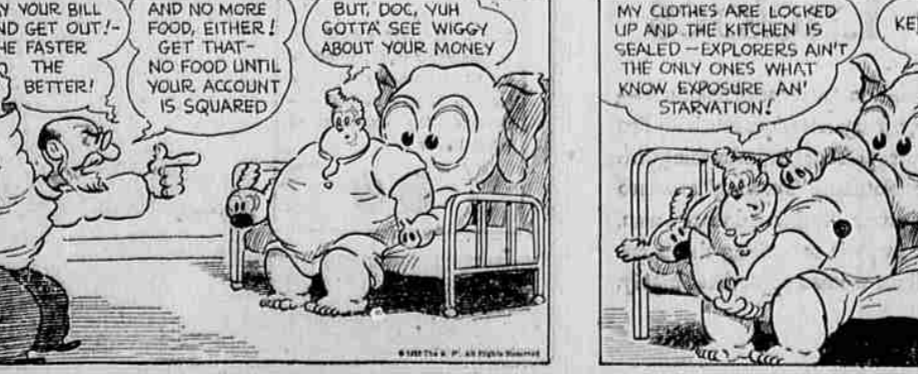
