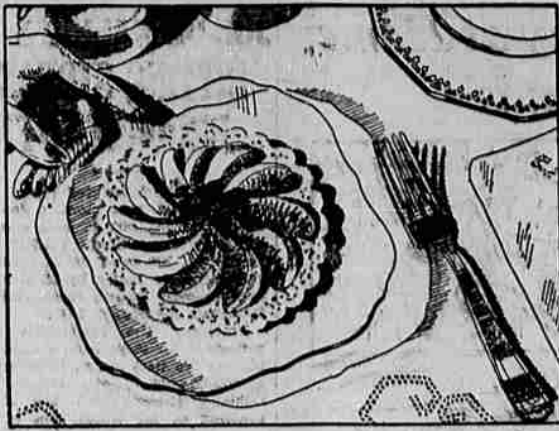

Something different from the usual ham-and-egg breakfast is most desirable at this season when even the easy-to-please become finicky. Fresh mint adds cooling flavor to your fruit dish, ripe tomatoes are an interesting condiment to the main dish — well, suppose you try this menu:

Orange Sections with Chopped

Fresh Mint
Ready-to-Eat Cereal
Chicken Hash with Sliced Chilled Tomatoes
Date Muffins

Chicken Hash with Sliced Chilled Tomatoes: Cut the contents of a 6-ounce can of chicken up fine, and mix with one cup of cold chopped potatoes. Season with salt and pepper, and add one-fourth cup milk. Brown in a skillet with plenty of fat, fold together like an omelet, and turn out onto a hot platter. Surround with sliced chilled fresh tomatoes.

Date muffins can be made by any good muffin recipe, by simply adding chopped dates to the batter just before putting it into the buttered muffin pans.
