JOE DE MAGGIO'S HITTING STREAK BROUGHT TO END

For almost two months Joe De Maggio banged out at least one hit off every Coast league pitcher who faced him, hit safely in 61 consecutive games to better by 12 the former 49-game league record set by Oakland's Joe Noss in 1915.

Yesterday the remarkable Seal youngster, an 18-year-old ex-newsboy playing his first season in organized baseball, went hitless, stopped by Oakland fielding and the steady pitching of Ed Walsh, son of the great Ed Walsh of Chicago White Sox fame.

The kid outfielder failed to hit safely, but his long fly to Pool scored Jack Fenton to give San Francisco a 5-4 victory over Oakland.
In his 61-game hitting streak De Maggio hit 104 times in 255 times at bat for an average of .405. His 104 hits included 17 doubles, six triples and 11 home runs.

Other Coast league engagements yesterday served to tighten further the already close pennant race. Buck Newsom's 5-hit tossing gave Los Angeles its second straight win over Sacramento 9-3, and sent the fourth

place Angels to within two games of the Senators.
Boston Tuesday, Hollywood recovered last night to square its series with Portland 9-6. Four Portland errors helped the Stars to two unearned runs. Vance Page granted the Beavers 11 blows while his mates collected 16, including three doubles and a single by Durst.

CLIFF BAKER PLAYS LOCAL GOLF COURSE

Dr. Cliff Baker, of Kalama, one of the up-and-coming amateur golfers in the northwest, is in La Grande today, visiting at the home of Mr. and Mrs. C. B. Miller and playing on the La Grande country club course with C. H. Reynolds. Dr. Baker played in the northwest tournament at Vancouver, B. C., the Canadian tournament at Victoria, B. C., and the Washington amateur at Spokane last week, and stopped here en route home. Mrs. Baker, who is accompanying him, is a sister of Mrs. Miller.

Crest Hartwick, Baker lightweight, who defeated Swede Daniels, of La Grande, on the last fight card here, will meet Ad Cadena, Portland, in a six-round special.

According to Promoter Eddie Shire, over twenty La Grande fans have written in here requesting reservations. This is expected to be only a forerunner of the crowd. Mickey Dempsey, of La Grande, will referee the semi and main event.
