IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OF OREGON you are required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled court and cause, on or before the 29th day of August, 1933, the said date being the last day of the five weeks period prescribed by order for the publication of this summons.

And if you fail to answer said complaint or otherwise plead herein, for want thereof, the above named plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief prayed for in its complaint, to-wit:

For judgment and decree against the defendants, Walter J. Henry and Mattie K. Henry, his wife, for the sum of \$2742.92, together with interest thereon at the rate of 4% per annum from the 10th day of January, 1932, until paid, and \$275.00, attorney fees, for the collection of plaintiff's note and foreclosure of plaintiff's mortgage, and for plaintiff's costs and disbursements incurred herein.

That the plaintiff's mortgage given to secure the note described in plaintiff's complaint be decreed to be a first and prior lien over all other liens and encumbrances and that the said sum of money above set forth be decreed to be a good, valid, and subsisting lien upon the said premises under and by virtue of the said mortgage, upon all of the property described in plaintiff's mortgage, to-wit:

Commencing at a point forty (40) rods West of the Northeast corner of Section four (4), in Township one (1) North Range thirty-nine (39), East of the Willamette Meridian, running thence West twenty-four (24) rods, thence South ten (10) rods,

thence East twenty-four (24) rods, thence North ten (10) rods to the place of beginning. Also, The North half (1/2) of the Southeast quarter (1/4) and the Southeast quarter (1/4) of Section thirty-three (33); also commencing at the Northeast corner of the Southeast quarter (1/4) of said Section thirty-three (33), and running thence South fifty-two (52) rods, thence Northwesterly to the Northwest corner of the Southwest quarter (1/4) of the Southeast quarter (1/4) of said Section thirty-three (33); thence East to the place of beginning. Being in Township Two (2) North Range thirty-nine (39), East of the Willamette Meridian.

same at the expiration of the time allowed by law for the redemption of real property, if no redemption be had.

That the equity of the defendants, J. D. Slater and Fannie B. Slater, his wife, and John Widell, and all persons claiming under them in and to said mortgaged property, or any part thereof, be forever barred and foreclosed of and from all right, title, lien, estate, or interest in and to or upon said mortgaged property, and every part thereof, saving and excepting only the statutory right of redemption.

That the said mortgage be declared to be prior in time and superior in right to any right, title, lien, estate or interest, or any claim of any right, title, lien, estate or interest which the defendants, Walter J.
