

### U. P. RAILROAD CO. PAYS DIVIDENDS

NEW YORK, Aug. 10 (AP) — Directors of the Union Pacific Railroad Co. today ordered the usual quarterly dividend of \$1.50 on the common stock, payable Oct. 2 to stock of record Sept. 1.

Dividends at this rate have been paid regularly since July, 1922, when the annual basis was reduced from \$1.00 to \$1.00.

### CUBANS ACT, CONDEMNING UNCLE SAM

President Roosevelt looked today for quick action in Cuba in response to his strong appeal to the island republic to stop political warfare and restore economic order.

The president carefully withheld open intervention in the interest of bringing about peace and happier times by the policy of mediation.

HYDE PARK, N. Y., Aug. 10 (AP) — President Roosevelt was assured today by Representative Fish, of New York, ranking Republican member of

the house foreign affairs committee, of united support in whatever action he deems necessary to restore order in Cuba.

Representative Fish declared the first step which must be taken in Cuba is the resignation of President Machado.

"I do not believe armed force is contemplated or is necessary," he said. "I have the fullest confidence in President Roosevelt and Ambassador Welles."

### Hay Situation In Oregon Is Better

PORTLAND, Aug. 10 (AP) — Further strengthening of the hay situation was reflected here with a shortage of alfalfa due to the smaller crop and the very tight holding at the source. In all districts growers appeared to believe that still higher values will be forced. The local trade is now up to \$17 ton buying price.

There was a shortage of oat and grain hays due to the damage done by the rains. Bids to growers were around \$14 ton Portland.
