With the war-cry of the blue eagle resounding so loudly, it would be easy to get the impression that little but the NRA is stirring in Washington.

That is far from the case. While General Johnson has been wrestling with codes and rumors of codes, problems of many different sorts have wrinkled the brows of officials in other quarters.

A Delicate Problem The attention attracted by the explosion in Cuba was small compared to the anxiety it caused the Washington government.

Mr. Roosevelt had not forgotten that when he ran for vice president in 1920, a political storm of great proportions arose over the part he had taken, as assistant secretary of the navy, in composing matters in Haiti through the use of United States marines.

In his peace note of May 15 he had taken the bold step of declaring against sending armed forces across any international boundary.

Yet in Cuba he had run plumb into a situation which by all the precedents called for the marines. What to do caused more worry than appeared on the surface.
