Aug. 28 (AP) — Shooting the same type of game that has captured seven consecutive titles this year, Helen Hicks, of New York, took an early lead in the race for the national women's golf championship medal today by scoring a 37, two under par, over the first nine at Exmoor.

Two shots behind the husky girl who won the national title in 1931 and then failed to qualify the next year, was Miss Enid Wilson, winner of the English championship three years in a row.

## Seaver Defeats Dr. Cliff Baker

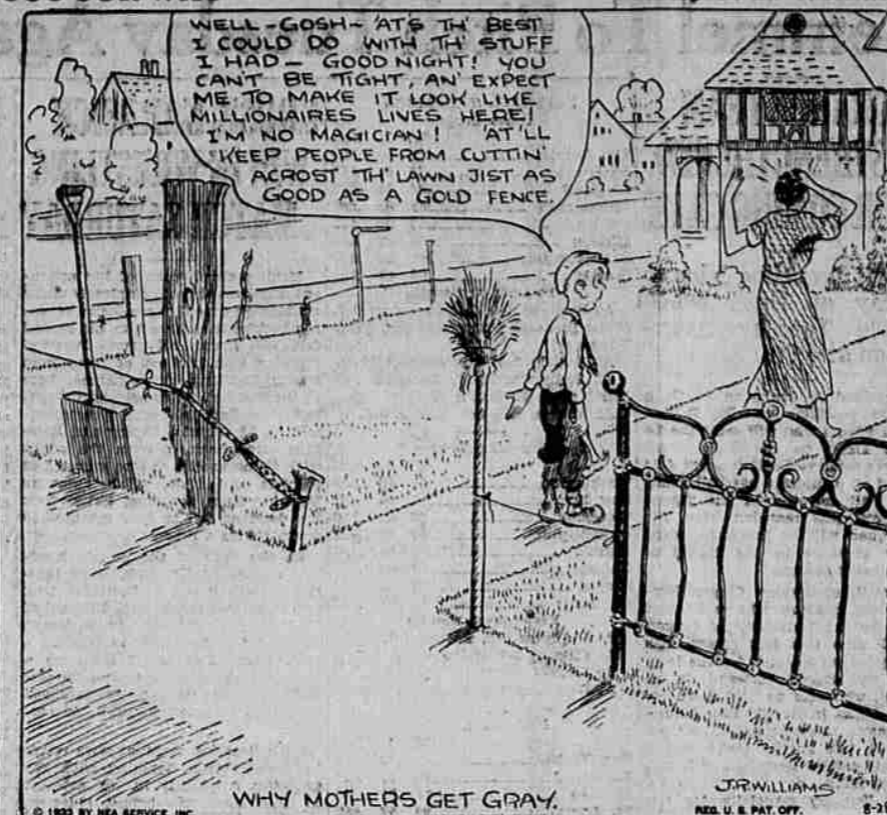
PEBBLE BEACH, Cal., Aug. 28 (AP) —Blond Charley Seaver, long-hitting, husky youngster from Los Angeles, is California's new state amateur golf champion.

The 23-year-old former collegian, who chased pars for Stanford last year and dropped out of school to enter business in his home town, captured the state's most prized golfing plum yesterday as he defeated Dr. Cliff Baker, of Portland, Ore.; 3-1 in the 36-hole final.

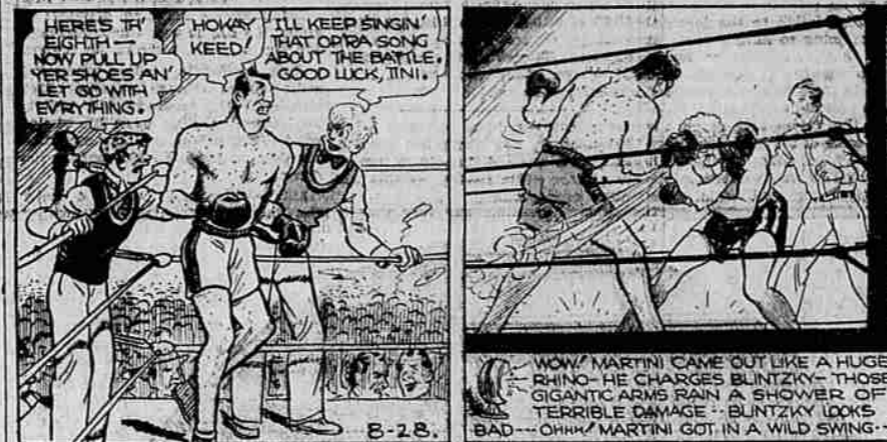

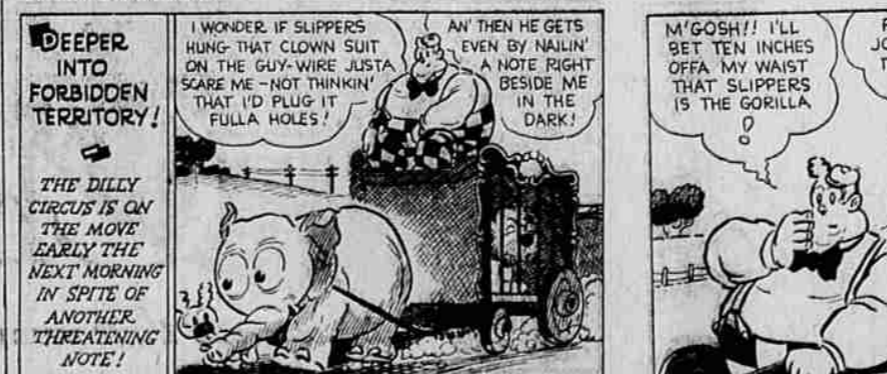
