SIGN CONTRACTS FOR 37 WARSHIPS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 2 (AP)—Secretary Swanson Friday signed contracts for 37 vessels to be constructed out of the \$238,000,000 allotted the navy from public works funds and congressional appropriations.

He also named the vessels, 21 to be constructed in private shipbuilding yards and 16 in navy yards. He named two other vessels under construction.

"I hope this is the beginning of a treaty navy—a navy built to the limits of the London naval treaty and second to none," he commented.
