SCHOOL CHILDREN AND WAR

It is not surprising that the school children who were examined in a survey by two professors of Columbia University, should have revealed a tendency to glorify everything connected with war.

Now is there any wonder that children have little grasp of the machinery of peace? Even adults might be found woefully lacking in knowledge of the Kellogg pact, the World Court, the League of Nations, and the intricacies surrounding these agencies.

But while the professors' survey reveals little that is surprising, it does call attention to the need for bringing forcibly home to future citizens the fact that war is a national catastrophe and that as such it is to be avoided if that is possible; and that good has seldom come from any war.

World armaments are far larger now than they were in 1914, and the world now as then is filled with international jealousies and suspicions, and rumors of war.

These facts, however, only make it more desirable to put forth every effort to avoid a new war, which would be infinitely more terrible than the last, and which many world leaders believe would bring the destruction of civilization.

It is not necessary to breed a nation of milksop pacifists. An understanding of what war really is, how wars are, and what is being done to minimize the chances of war, can be combined with a healthy patriotism.
