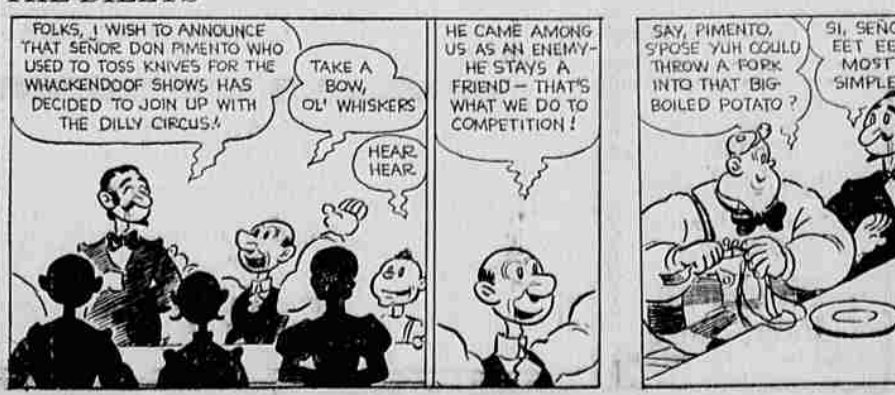

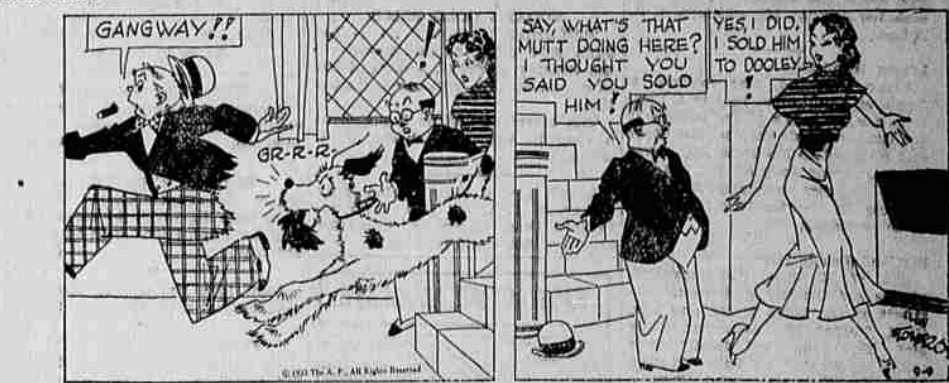

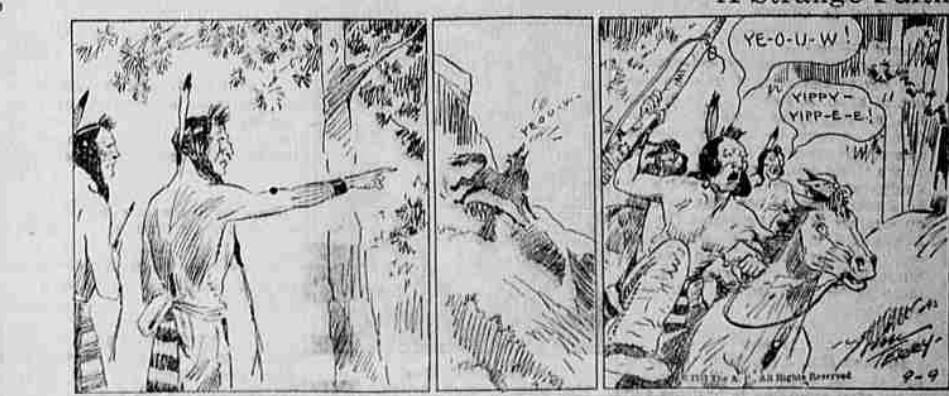

WIRELESS TELEGRAPH OF EQUATORIAL AFRICA!

GOLF BALLS WERE STUFFED WITH FEATHERS IN THE EARLY DAYS OF THE GAME.

THE GOUDOU GOUDOU is usually placed in the middle of the village, just in front of the chief's hut, where there will be no delay when a message is to be sent. The sticks used in pounding out the signals are tipped in natural rubber, which gives more volume to the sounds. When placed on the bank of a river, the goudougoudou can sometimes be heard ten miles.
