LISBON, Portugal, Sept. 11 (P)—Ten bulls broke loose today in the nearby village of Sobral and charged into the crowd at the annual summer festival, injuring 20 persons, three of them probably fatally.

The bulls smashed articles in China shops, fancy stalls and cafes, and wrecked the bandstand. A barber killed one bull with a razor and the others were rounded up.
