NEW YORK, Sept. 13 (AP) — Security markets, closing at noon today for the huge New York NRA demonstration, generally followed a narrow and featureless range. Except for a few specialties, which were run up for gains of as much as 2 points, most stocks were content to hold just a little better than their levels of yesterday. The finish was firm. Transfers approximated 900,000 shares.

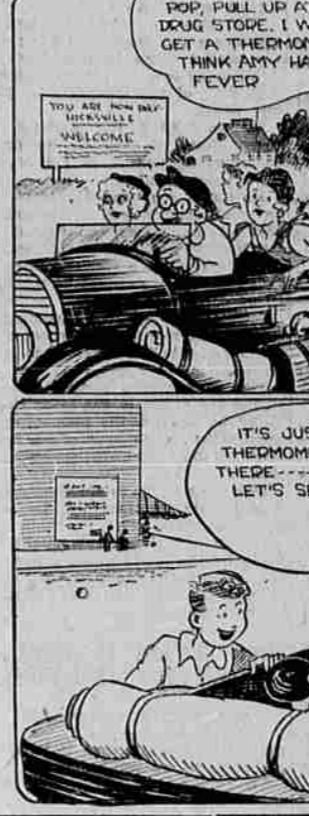

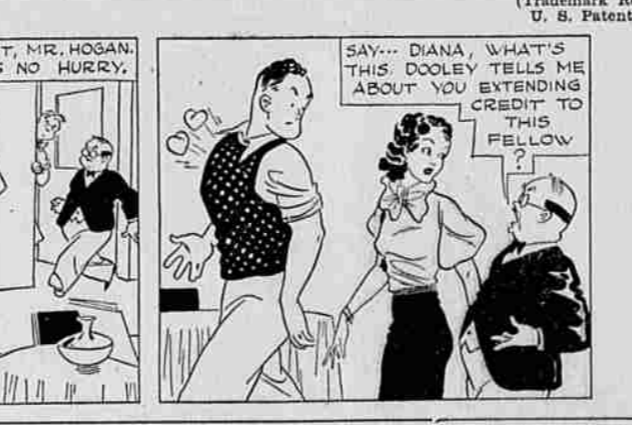
