OREGON BUTTER PRICES DECLINE

PORTLAND, Sept. 14 (AP)—In line with the general weakness of the butter market, prices declined locally. Butterfat dropped 2c, effective today, to 19c Portland delivery and 17c at country delivery points. The produce exchange lowered extras 2c to 20c, standards 1 1/2c to 19 1/2c, prime firsts 1c to 19 1/2c and firsts 1 1/2c to 18c. The coast market has a general undertone of weakness. Coast storage holdings stand at the huge total of 10,821,009 pounds compared with 9,054,272 pounds at the same time a year ago. Holdings were declined but little from a week ago when they totaled 10,869,537 pounds. The lower prices and cooler weather along the coast should have a stimulating effect on the retail movement and give the primary market a better tone.

Packing sows ruled \$3.65 @ \$3.75, light sows to \$4, feeder pigs quotable \$4.75 down. Sheep: 1000, slow, around steady. Lambs, good and choice, \$5.25 @ \$6.25; common and medium, \$4.00 @ \$5.25; yearling wethers, \$3.75 @ \$4.00; ewes, medium to choice, \$1.25 @ \$2.25; cull and common, 75c @ \$1.25. An airplane was used this year by farmers in Coosima county, Miss., to dust cotton for boll weevils. Only 640,000 sheep were shorn in Indiana this year, compared with 655,000 last year.
