Orange Dessert Cake—(1 egg)

2 teaspoons grated orange rind

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift together three times. Add orange rind to butter and cream thoroughly; add sugar thoroughly, and cream together until light and fluffy. Add egg and beat thoroughly; then add raisins and blend. Add flour, alternately with milk, a small amount at a time. Beat after each addition until smooth. Bake in greased pan, 8 x 8 x 2 inches, in moderate oven (350° F.) 50 minutes. Cool cake 15 hours. Combine orange juice and sugar and stir until sugar is dissolved. Spread part of mixture over cake, repeating at intervals until all has been used. (All measurements are level)
