HIGH RATING IS GIVEN TO ENKAY DAIRY BY STATE

Regular grade A milk inspection by the state department of agriculture locally resulted in a report for the Enkay Dairy that was very satisfactory to its operators.

Hans Selfors, state inspector, said: "Milk plant and dairy in very good order. Recommend public inspection and patronage." Not one check was placed against the dairy in the entire list of requirements. Sanitation, ventilation, sterilization and all other protective features were judged to be 100 per cent up to requirements.

The Enkay Dairy has long been recognized as one of the modern establishments of its kind not only in Eastern Oregon, but in the entire Pacific northwest.

N. K. West is proprietor of the dairy, which is located about ten miles north of La Grande on the Pleasant Grove market road. Cannot Exchange Home Loan Bonds, Van Winkle Rules

SALEM, Sept. 28 (AP) — The state corporation commission cannot exchange bonds of the home owners loan corporation for mortgages now held by it in savings and loan associations, nor can savings and loan associations invest any part of their assets in the purchase of these bonds, have been anticipated by the legisla-

This was the opinion of Attorney General I. H. Van Winkle to Corporation Commissioner Charles H. Carey. Van Winkle held that bonds issued by the federal home owners loan corporation are not bonds of the United States in the sense that term is used for the reason the United States guarantees only the interest and is not under obligation to pay the principal.

Van Winkle declared "the existing contingency is one which could not be anticipated by the legisla-

ture. The statutes impose a limitation upon the power of savings and loan associations which can only be removed by legislative action or judicial decision."

EARLY SETTLER DIES IN OXNARD

Mrs. Margaret A. Trest, a pioneer of the northwest, died Sunday at her home in Oxnard, Cal. It was learned here.

She was born March 19, 1846 near Okaloosa, Ia., and in the spring of 1862 came across the plains with her

parents in a wagon train of 175 wagons and some 200 mounted men acting as guards. Her father was captain of their train and was wounded in one of several encounters with Indians. The party reached the Grande Ronde valley on Sept. 5, 1862 after nearly six months on the road.

June 2, 1863, she was married to W. M. Ewing at La Grande and they later moved to Walla Walla. Mr. Ewing died in 1883 and she married Fred W. Thiel in Walla Walla. His death occurred in 1913.
