FIRE PREVENTION ENGINEERS HERE FOR INSPECTION

Four fire prevention engineers arrived in La Grande yesterday for special intensive inspection work of public and business properties. Special attention will be given the elimination of hazards that cause fire in the schools and other public places where people, particularly children, gather in large numbers.

The work is in charge of O. M. Thurber, manager of the public relations department of the General and First National Insurance Companies of America, and his assistants are Charles Parker, William Hooper and Reese Lewis. They have been brought here as a special service to the community by the Chas. H. Reynolds Insurance agency and their expert advice is open to any citizen of La Grande, gratis.

La Grande has had its share of fires in past years although the record thus far in 1933 has been one of the best in the state of Oregon. It is possible to continue with just as favorable a record if proper attention is given to fire prevention and fire protection problems. A continued favorable record would be reflected in reduced rates for fire insurance and the saving of thousands of dollars annually to our people, according to Mr. Reynolds. The special work now being done by these engineers is for the purpose of assisting and establishing ways and means for the continued favorable record and assuring future savings in insurance costs.

Yesterday Mr. Thurber addressed the Rotary club during the noon luncheon at the La Grande hotel. His subject was "Indirect Taxes."

pointed out that the insurance companies did not pay losses but instead the insuring public pays every cent for every loss that occurs in a community. This is done through the indirect taxation collected in the way of premiums by the insurance companies. Just what those indirect taxes will be is determined by the people of the city themselves.

He explained how rates were made and stated that every hazard existing in a property at the time the representative of the rating bureau makes his inspection are charged for. He told how that through the carelessness of the people approximately \$500,000 in property value is burned up in this country every year and that more serious yet is the annual sacrifice to the Fire God of 15,000 human lives most of them women and children. At least eighty per cent of this terrific annual loss is preventable and is caused through the existence of careless hazards that careless people permit in their homes and other buildings, he said.

By the end of this week Mr. Thurber and his assistants expect to cause the removal of hundreds of such hazards in La Grande. If this is done Mr. Reynolds is due a lot of appreciation for his services in bringing these prevention engineers to our city. It is pointed out.

While here Mr. Thurber will give talks on fire prevention and traffic safety to the students of the High school and all grade schools in an effort to arouse the interest of the children and young people in carrying fire prevention into the homes. That this is an essential problem is proved by the fact that a fire occurs in an American home every four minutes of every day of every year and two thirds of the loss in life by fire is in the homes and caused through hazards that should not have existed.

CANADA TO KILL 2000 BUFFALO

OTTAWA, Sept. 28 (AP)—The slaughter of 2000 buffalo in Wainwright national park, Alberta, has been approved by the government. Tenders are being requested for purchase of the hides during November and December.

The animals to be killed are 800 bulls, two years of age; 150 bulls, three years old; 200 cows, three years old; and 1,150 aged bulls and cows.

Wives Considered Partners by NRA

PORTLAND, Sept. 28 (AP)—Wives working in stores jointly operated by a married couple are considered partners, and are not subject to the provisions of the reemployment agreement, Washington NRA officials informed the district office at Portland today. Other members of the immediate family, however, are subject to the NRA provisions governing hours of work and wages.
