# WHITMAN OFF TO HEAD START IN NORTHWEST PLAY

Whitman college gained a head start on the other Northwest conference football teams Saturday when the Missionaries won a close struggle from Linfield college, 7 and 6, on their home grounds, in the first conference game of the season.

It will be three more weeks before all seven schools start the conference race. Albany and College of Puget Sound enter the campaign when they meet at Albany, Ore., next Saturday. Pacific and Willamette get under way the following week and College of Idaho swings into line Oct. 21.

Other games Saturday saw Pacific nose out Columbia of Portland, 7 and 6 on the latter's field; Willamette defeat Oregon Normal at Salem, 20 to 0, and College of Puget Sound take a 56 to 0 trimming from Washington State college at Pullman.

Linfield meets Pacific Lutheran at Tacoma, Pacific tangles with Southern Oregon Normal at Ashland; Eastern Oregon Normal plays Lewiston Normal here Friday, and Whitman clashes with the University of Idaho at Moscow next Saturday. Willamette and College of Idaho will be idle.

# Harry Elliott Beats Jackson; Knifer Assists

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 3 (AP)—Harry Elliott, Portland referee, turned wrestler last night and with the assistance of an unidentified, knife-wielding spectator, won the main event from Bulldog Jackson, of Klamath Falls. Each weighed 160. The Labor Temple auditorium was crammed to its 1700 capacity, and several hundred persons were turned away.

Jackson, who several times has put on impromptu "bouts" with Elliott when the latter was referee, took the first fall in 20 minutes with a hammerlock.

On his way to the dressing room after the fall, Jackson was attacked by the unidentified knife wielder and stabbed deeply in the right leg. Police immediately held two suspects, but released them when they were found to have no knife.

After receiving medical attention, Jackson was able to return to the ring, but Elliott had little trouble in throwing him with a body slam in four minutes, and Elliott was advised by his physician not to attempt to return for the final fall. Elliott won on a default.

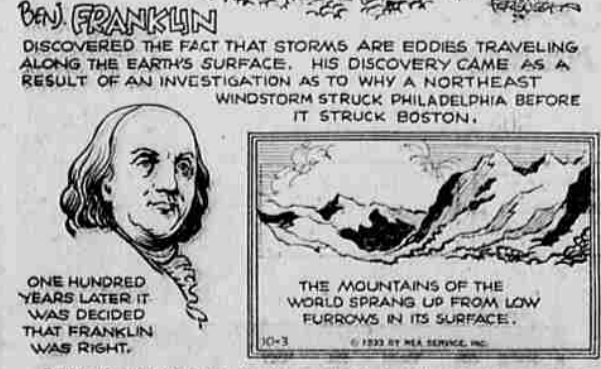
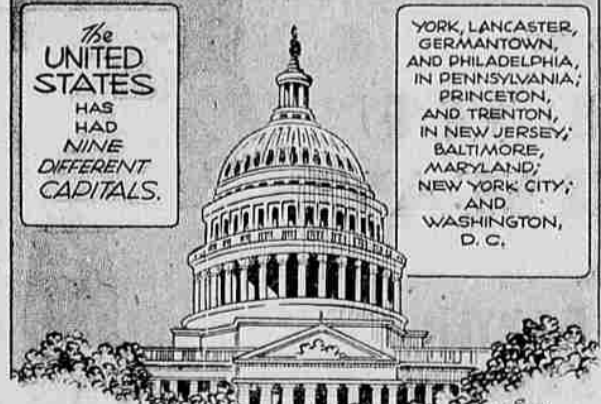
Orchardists are taking advantage of the weather to move ahead rapidly on apple and prune picking activities.

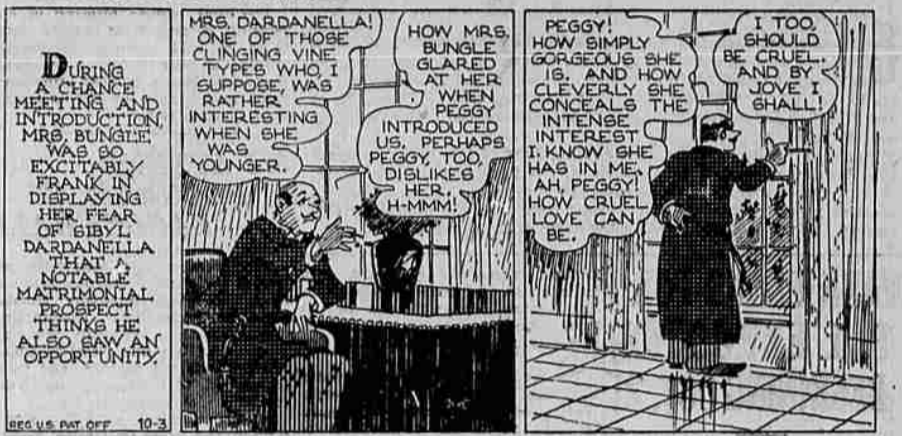

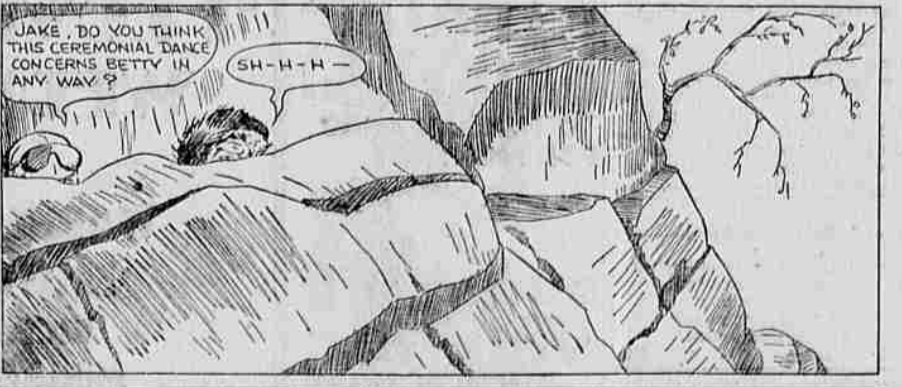
