Chapter I, P. E. O. Is Entertained

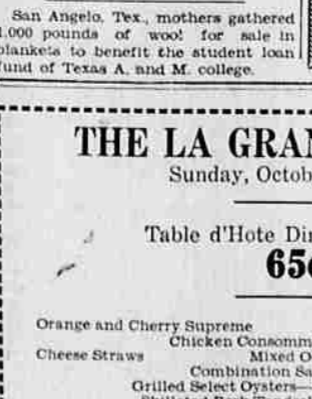

Funeral services will be held at the Snodgrass and Zimmerman mortuary at 2 p. m. Sunday after which the body will be sent to Roulet, Pa. for burial in the family plot.

Mr. Tauscher was born in New York June 12, 1859 and was 74 years, four months and eight days of age. He leaves the following children: Mrs. Donella Johnson, of La Grande; Mrs. Della Schertenleib, of Elgin; Mrs. Bessie Hunter, of The Dalles, and Robert William Tauscher, of Genoa, N. Y., besides other relatives.

In the third quarter Crawford returned a Lewiston punt 15 yards and then sent a flat pass to Smith who stepped around two would-be tacklers and scored standing up.

The Mountaineers started another scoring march but an intercepted pass halted this. Soon afterwards Las-

gained consistently, both playing a kicking game largely. Lewiston, attempting to kick out of danger, gave the Mountaineers two points when Camman, who replaced Berney, blocked a punt that rolled out of bounds in the end zone.

Then Crawford rifled a long pass to Hanks, who was run out of bounds on the five-yard line. Two attempts by Smith and Hodgen advanced the pigskin to the two-yard line and then Crawford slipped over for the score, making the count 14 to 0.
