

AMATEUR BOXERS
WILL ENROLL ON
FRIDAY EVENING

With eyes trained on the N. B. A. national championships in the east and the next Olympic Games, the favorite amateur fighting sons of hereabouts are marking time as they make ready to throw into Eagles hall tomorrow night to enroll for free training and as color bearers for their city in the Eagles big relief fund benefit championship amateur boxing tournament on the nights of Nov. 21, 22 and 23.

Amplifying heavyweights and amateurs in all other weight classes will assemble for the enrollment session tomorrow night. The time is 7:30. Charles Hildebrand, Louis Evans, Frank Soward, and other officials, as well as the trainers, engaged to coach the amateurs, will be in charge of the meeting tomorrow night.

Officials of the Eagles today announced they had engaged Roy Parham, Ira Woodie, and J. H. Pearce as eligibility committee to pass on the amateur status of all contestants. Their decisions are to be final when it comes to ruling a competitor out of the big meet on grounds of professionalism, it was pointed out.

There are to be from 15 to 20 exciting bouts each evening of the three-night tourney, with the La Grande amateurs competing against the outsiders. The first fight is to start each night at promptly 8:15 and the last struggle must end not later than 10:30, tourney chieftains promise.

Seem Numbered

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Nov. 2 (AP) — Notre Dame's football coaching problems, agitating the best minds of the university and its alumni ever since the death of Knute Kenneth Rockne, have not yet been completely solved, sundry and conflicting reports to the contrary notwithstanding.

For the time being Hunk Anderson is being given full support in the attempt to achieve some recovery from this year's dismal start, particularly in the climax games with Southern California and Army, the two arch rivals of the Irish. There is no secret, however, that this is Hunk's last year as head coach and that steps already have been taken to install another alumnus of the Notre Dame system in charge of the 1934 squad.

Noble E. Klizer, one of the "seven mules" of 1923-24 who opened the holes for the famous "Four Horsemen" and now head coach at Purdue, stands at the head of the list of coaches favored to succeed Anderson. He may be under contract already.
